Dual Enrollment Articulation with Central Penn College – John Trovato shared the Dual Enrollment Articulation Agreement with Central Penn College, which offers eligible PV learners the opportunity to take in-person or online classes. This agreement will be included for approval at the November 11 Board meeting.

Concession Stand Update – John Bowden updated the Board on how the concession stand is currently being operated. The Board suggested that we ask other schools how their stands are being operated. Mr. Hartmann suggested looking for a central manager to run the operations, and he proposed that maybe an existing staff member who needs or wants extra hours would be willing to handle this.
