	<p>The Early Learning Investment in the PV Community has continued to progress!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● 2019- 17% of incoming kindergarten learners attended a kindergarten readiness workshop. ○ 19% kindergarten learners considered ready per IU screener.● 2020- 54% of incoming kindergarten learners were registered by May 1st. ○ 23% Kindergarten learners considered ready per IU screener.● 2021- 65% registered by May 1st, 88% received kindergarten readiness kit, 69% attended a PV Building Braves Early Learning program.● 2022- 88% registered by May 1st, 92% received kindergarten readiness kit, 86% attended a PV Building Braves Early Learning program.
	<p>2023 Update:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● We hosted our three Kindergarten Transition Nights at both elementary buildings 63 learners on the registration list and 43 attended.● Kindergarten Screenings at The Brave Kids Learning Center and screened 35 learners the week of April 17th. (CAP has screened their learner and will share info)● Enrolled 3 new families in the Home Visiting Program in April.● Imagination Library enrollment has hit an all-time high this quarter having 229 children receiving books monthly.● Kindergarten Ready Camp: Hosting June 19-22nd and June 26-29th● PV Summer Lunch and Learns: Wednesdays in July 10:30am-12pm at Paradise Park
