MUSIC

K4 has been having so much autumn fun in music class. The children have been learning that we can make music not only with our voices but also with instruments. We have been singing and moving to fun autumn songs and have been exploring many of our classroom instruments. ART

ART

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Over the course of October we were working on our rolling, tossing and throwing skills. When practicing with your student the big "look for" is stepping with opposite foot of throwing arm. This allows for more space in rolling and tossing for arm swing. Then for overhand throw, opposition allows the student to be ready for trunk rotation in 2nd and 3rd grade. For overhand throw you should see a big arm circle, to big arm (like you are flexing your muscle) and finally a release of the ball forward.

Jump Rope challenges for second graders to try at home are to jump forwards and backwards consecutive jumps using a single rope! We have also really been practicing using trunk rotation when we throw overhand in our rolling and throwing games to practice our offensive skills! Lastly we introduced how to play offense AND defense in our throwing games!

ART



In art class we are working on creating our fall pumpkins based on the technique of pointillism. We are looking at artwork created by artist Georges Seurat. We are learning to CREATE, RESPOND, PRESENT and CONNECT to what we are making in art class. We love using our drawing skills, learning and using cotton swabs and dots to create light, shadow, tints and shades. Using color techniques with acrylic paints makes our work really POP!!! We are creating our own unique pieces that represent who we are as artists! We are also connecting what we see in the world with our own works.

Ask them to clap this ostinato.

Jump Rope challenges for 3rd graders will be filled with tricks this year! We have begun with basic consecutive forward and backward jumps but moved into one foot forward or backward jumps as well! We have also really been practicing using trunk rotation and follow through when we throw overhand to increase our power and distance as well as accuracy during our throwing games!
