Superintendent's Message

It's an exciting time to be a Canton South Wildcat as we've had a fantastic start to the school year. Our students and staff have all been working extremely hard, and we are proud of all they have accomplished so far. Additionally, we are grateful for the outstanding support we've received from our families and the community.

Our fall sports season has been very successful. Our football team completed the first 10-0 season in school history, making them back-to-back PAC-7 Champions. The girls' tennis team continued to build

on their excellent tradition by winning the league for the second consecutive year. Additionally, both our girls' golf team and boys' soccer team set school records for victories in a season. Our middle school boys' cross-country team finished fifth in the Ohio State Meet, demonstrating their dedication and talent. Furthermore, we've witnessed significant improvements in the performance and win totals of several other fall sports teams.

In the arts, we are thrilled to have over 145 students from grades 3 to 12 participating in our fall production of Annie. Our Marching Band, alongside featured Twirler Kaylynn Egan, has received standing ovations from visiting crowds, and our show choir, Sounds of South, is ready for another outstanding year filled with captivating performances.

Academically, we have shown progress, with an improved rating of 3.5 stars out of 5 for the 2022-2023 school year. We've witnessed improvements in our graduation rating, rising from 3 stars to 4 stars, and while we still have a lot of work to do, we've improved from 1-star to a 2-star rating in the progress component. Importantly, we've maintained a 5-star rating in gap closing, showcasing our commitment to ensuring equal opportunities for all our students.

One of our key areas of focus for improvement this year is attendance. Last year, our chronic absenteeism rate was at 30.9%. The State of Ohio defines chronic absenteeism as students missing 10% or more of the school year. To address this, we've partnered with the Cleveland Browns and their Stay in the Game Organization to provide incentives for student attendance. We are actively working to recognize students with outstanding attendance records. Most importantly we want to partner with families to make sure that we are meeting the needs of our students, so that all of our students are here with us as much as possible. I firmly believe that we can accomplish great things if we have our students and staff here together.

In closing, thank you again to our students, staff, families, and community for everything you do for Canton Local Schools. I am so proud of the many outstanding achievements within our district and look forward to continuing to work alongside all of you as we strive to achieve our mission of guiding every Wildcat graduate towards finding their E: Enrolled, Enlisted, or Employed. I hope everyone has a great holiday season and Go Wildcats!

Residents Pay Less Tax, Utility Companies Pay More



Assessed property values are the basis for property tax collection in the State of Ohio. Many school districts, including Canton Local, rely on local property taxes as a significant source of the annual budget. Property taxpayers are broken up into three categories, each paying a different effective tax rate: Residential/Agricultural (homeowners and farmers), Other (mainly businesses), and Public Utility Personal Property (electric and gas/oil companies).

Think of the entire tax obligation of the district's taxpayers as a whole pie, with each of the three categories paying a certain percentage of the pie. As one group increases or decreases, the other types pick up a smaller or larger portion of the pie.

Public utility valuations (company worth) have nearly doubled in the past five years due to legislative changes and improvements made to power facilities in our District. What this means is that our public utility companies are paying a significantly larger percentage of the district's taxes. This shift has resulted in lower tax rates for residential taxpayers over the same period. The effective tax rate paid by residential taxpayers in 2014 was approximately 38 mills. In 2023, the effective tax rate dropped to just slightly over 26 mills, saving homeowners nearly 12 mills.

These changes have a significant impact on the Bond Levy that passed in 2013 at an estimated 8 mills, or about \$248 per year for a \$100,000 homeowner. Since our public utilities are paying more, the actual 2023 rate being collected to repay the bonded debt is only 4.1 mills, or about \$125 per year for the same \$100,000 homeowner – a savings of \$123 per year.



In 2014, homeowners paid the highest percentage of the district's taxes by a considerable margin.






CS Team Hosts Harlem Wizards


Stark Legacy Project Provides Student With Positive Mentors




Career Academy Receives \$4.2 Million For HVAC Program

The South Stark Career Academy (SSCA) has been selected to receive substantial expansion funding of \$4.2 million from the Governor's office to enhance its Career Technical Education (CTE) offerings. This funding will be instrumental in the expansion of SSCA's curriculum to include a state-of-the-art heating, ventilation, and air-conditioning (HVAC) program, which will be based at Canton South High School.

"We are thrilled to expand opportunities for our students to acquire valuable skills that will make them immediately employable at a living wage upon graduating from high school, said Superintendent Yeagley, "This funding will enable us to add an HVAC program to our CTE offerings, which is a significant step towards meeting the demands of our students and community. Currently, we have approximately 100 students each year on a waiting list, unable to gain access to our popular Trade and Industry programs. Adding the HVAC program will increase capacity and allow us to serve up to 50 additional students each year, an opportunity that would be impossible without this funding."

The newly established HVAC program will be housed at the Canton South campus, serving as an expansion to the existing Hayden Career Annex. The Hayden Career Annex is presently home to SSCA's automotive, construction, welding/metal fabrication, and small animal science programs, offering students a comprehensive array of career technical education opportunities.


Wildcat Football Team Takes PAC Championship


