Inclusion Benefits All

This past season, students of various abilities experienced the joys of a Minnesota summer with Edina Community Ed, offering an inclusive environment for all. The word “inclusion” has become a common buzzword. But what does it really mean?

Inclusion benefits all young people. Inclusion benefits kids with disabilities because it gives them equitable access to the opportunities all children deserve, with peer interaction being one of the most meaningful experiences. Inclusion allows young people without disabilities to learn more about the world, each other, and to prepare for adulthood in a diverse world. In these ways, all young people benefit from inclusion in Edina programming.

Tim Faklis is the Edina Community Education Inclusion and Youth Programs Support manager. A strong proponent of inclusive programming, he has worked in Kids Club programming for nine years. Faklis enjoys working with students with special needs because of the focused, meaningful interactions he can share with them. Faklis explains

that “seeing a young person’s journey and growth is why I do what I do.”

Community Ed partners with the Unified program, a Special Olympics program, for enrichment camps throughout the summer. Unified pairs students with various abilities in academic and social settings to build lifelong friendships. The Unified program has a presence during the school day in middle school and high school. Faklis sees an opportunity to continue to grow Unified programming in after-school, summer, and non-school settings.

Students like MaKayla Levy benefit from Unified programming. MaKayla is a sophomore at Edina High School. MaKayla uses non-verbal communication and has a cognitive disability, as



well as neurodivergences. She enjoyed Unified programming when she attended South View middle school during the school year and made friends in the program. But when summer came, there was no programming that met MaKayla’s needs. It felt like “pure isolation” explains MaKayla’s mother, Melissa. Eventually, Melissa found herself leaving the workplace to fill the gaps in childcare. The Levy family’s experience highlights the need for robust programming for students with disabilities during after-school and non-school times.

Edina Community Ed offered weekly Unified programming in summer 2023 to help fill this need for families. Camps and other programs allow children with disabilities to keep their routine and see familiar faces and friends. In addition, young people without disabilities get to see their peers with disabilities enjoying childhood and having fun. Through these experiences, both groups of students are exposed to a richer, wider, and more accurate view of the world.

Mattie Jenney, who is a Special Education teacher at Normandale Elementary, ran the Unified enrichment program this past summer. She shares that the program gave all students the opportunity

to experience a summer camp. Students could “engage, learn, and teach each other. We had a fun time learning and doing activities all summer,” Jenney reflects.

Elementary student Benjamin Caldwell enjoyed a positive Kids Club experience this past summer. “He was absolutely ecstatic to go to Kids Club every morning, and the staff there said he was a light in their day,” Benjamin’s mother Maura says. Benjamin has a brain injury from meningitis that resulted in cognitive delays and severe apraxia of speech. He is deeply attuned to the sensory experiences in life, with a special love for mud, sand, and water. Maura watched Benjamin thrive this summer, expressing, “I’m so happy he’s out experiencing the world like an 8-year-old and that I know he’s safe and loved while doing so.”

Edina Community Ed is committed to strengthening inclusive programming for young people across the community. All community members can volunteer, participate, and expand their thinking on inclusivity in Edina. As Melissa Levy says, inclusive programming should be “a part of who we are as a community and to embrace that.”

Students Make an Impact Through Service Learning

This fall, the Edina Kids Club at Countryside Elementary organized a multi-faceted service learning project benefiting students and the greater Edina community.

For the past two years, 4th and 5th grade students at Countryside have participated in a Walk to End Alzheimers with the Edina Senior Center. This fall, students decided to amplify their impact by hosting a bake sale fundraiser in the weeks leading up to the walk.

Students advertised the bake sale by decorating the Countryside cafeteria with handmade signs and purple streamers. (Purple is the official color of the Alzheimer’s Association.) The bake sale was a hit, with many parents purchasing baked goods after picking up their kids from the Countryside Kids Club program. The students’ efforts paid off, earning over \$600 for the Alzheimer’s Association through the bake sale.

On the day of the Walk to End Alzheimer’s, staff and students journeyed together from Countryside Elementary to the Edina Senior Center. There, they joined senior residents from the Waters of Edina. After the walk, the staff and students stayed to visit with the residents. One resident commented, “We really enjoy the students coming. It keeps us healthy, too!”

Reflecting on the event, Kids Club Lead Owen Kilanowski shared, “One of my proudest moments was watching the students be so respectful, patient, and kind with the senior residents at the event.”

After the event, one student participant remarked, “It was fun to meet all the people there and they were all really nice!”

Through this hands-on service learning experience, students were able to connect with the community, understand an important cause, and realize how they can make an impact through action. The Edina Kids Club staff aims to provide more opportunities like the Walk to End Alzheimers and the bake sale because they give students meaningful real-world experiences beyond the classroom.

DIY Art Lanterns

Light up colder days with these easy and colorful lanterns.

Materials needed:

- mod podge*
- glass jars
- tissue paper
- paint brush
- flameless tealight candles

**If you don't have mod podge, mix two parts glue with one part water to create adhesive.*



Steps:

1. Choose a variety of tissue paper, and rip up into small sections
2. Once you've made sure the glass is clean and dry, pick up pieces of tissue paper by dipping your brush into the Mod Podge, and then paint them onto the jar. (Remember a small amount can go a long way!)

The Value of Multi-Age Education

Community Ed provides both teaching and learning experience for high school student Derrick Siu

Some of the greatest impacts of community education occur when learning experiences are shared across multiple age groups. The past two summers, current Edina High School 12th grade student Derrick Siu experienced multi-age group learning through volunteering in community education STEM camps for younger students.

After speaking with his school counselor about summer volunteering opportunities, Derrick discovered he could combine his interest in helping kids and his passion for STEM by working with young people in community education camps. As a volunteer, Derrick assisted the instructor in prepping for classes and provided one-on-one support for young learners. Over the course of two and a half months, Derrick gained skills in teaching, classroom management, and even new knowledge in his coding expertise.

Derrick's favorite memories from the past two summers include two camps: Build a Boat and Coding. With small classes of 15 to 20 students, he built authentic connections with young people. His favorite camp moments were "getting to see [students'] excited faces whenever they got to do a challenge or create something new on their own."

He added, "They loved getting to create and build things, which was fun to watch."

One of Derrick's students was so advanced in coding that he shared knowledge Derrick himself didn't learn until high school! This student and Derrick enjoyed teaching each other new code throughout the camp. When reflecting on his experience, Derrick says, "I was thinking that if we were able to open up this opportunity to more of these kinds of kids, just imagine the type of things they could do when they grow up, it's incredible."

Derrick's experience highlights the value of multi-age educational relationships in community education. He shares, "Even though the children were learning, I was also learning." He went on to explain that being involved in the Community Ed camps as a high school student exposed him to classroom management and organization. He also developed leadership skills. Working closely with the instructors allowed Derrick to envision himself teaching a similar camp or class in the future.

As Derrick's experience illustrates, community education has the capacity to provide mutually beneficial learning experiences where both instructors and students can expand their knowledge, learn new things, and find common passions.



Early Childhood Family Education

Polish Dill Pickle Soup

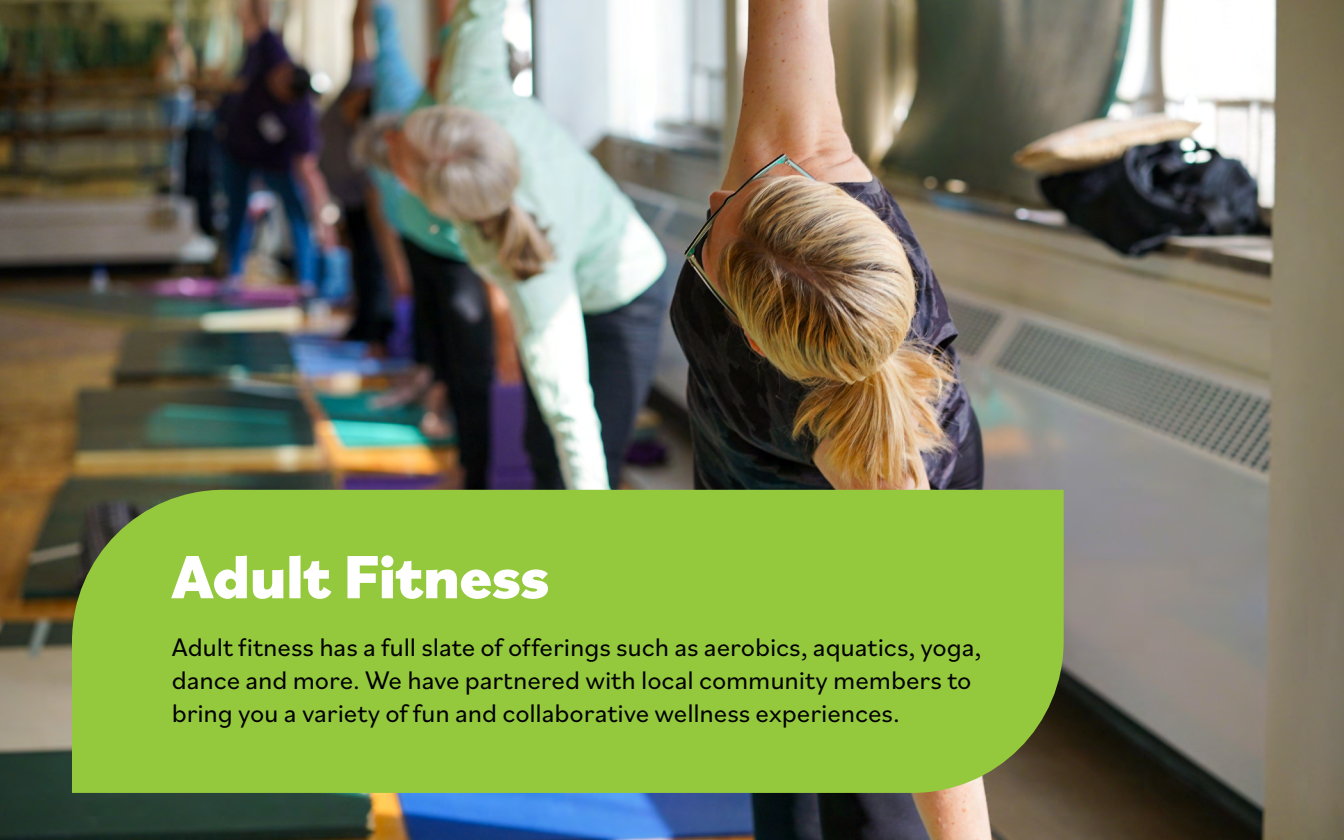
Ingredients

- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 large yellow onion
- 2 large carrots
- 2 large stalks celery
- 5 large cloves garlic
- 1 pound yellow potatoes
- 1 cup diced dill pickles
- 4 cups vegetable broth
- ¾ teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon black pepper
- 3 dried whole allspice berries
- ¾ cup sour cream
- ¼ cup dill pickle juice
- 3 tablespoons minced fresh dill



Instructions

1. Chop the onion, carrot, and celery all about the same size.
2. Peel the potatoes, and cut them into ½-inch cubes.
3. Shred the dill pickles a bit smaller.
4. Add the butter to a 5-quart pot over medium heat. Once the butter is mostly melted, stir in the onion, carrot, and celery. Cook until the vegetables are starting to soften, about 5 minutes, stirring occasionally.
5. Add the garlic and cook for 30 seconds, stirring constantly.
6. Add the potato, dill pickle, vegetable broth, salt, black pepper, and allspice, and stir. Turn up the heat to bring the soup to a boil, and then turn the heat down so the soup simmers, cover the pot, and cook until the vegetables are softened but not mushy, about 10 minutes.
7. Use a potato masher to coarsely mash some of the vegetables.
8. Remove from the heat and stir in the sour cream, dill pickle juice, and minced fresh dill. Serve and Enjoy!

Hometown Homer: Edina Resident’s Odyssey

Greek history is Stephen Partridge’s passion. A former college professor, Partridge, who goes by Kurt, has authored six historical novels about Greek comedy, poets, and culture. During his research journey, Partridge realized he could share his passion and expertise for Greek history by teaching classes in the community education space.

In the fall of 2022, Partridge began teaching through Edina Community Education. He quickly gained a following of students interested in Greek history. Attendees return to Partridge’s classes, session after session, allowing him to now incorporate student feedback in future planning.

Partridge describes himself as a passionate, self-taught, lifelong learner, as opposed to an expert. Reflecting on his experience as a new teacher, Partridge shares, “You learn so much from trying to teach a class. You have to know the material so thoroughly and prepare slides and talking points. I don’t want to mislead anyone with inaccurate facts.” As Partridge indicates, teaching prep requires many hours of ongoing research and learning.

In the classroom, Partridge aims for a light, humorous, and engaging teaching style. Though his classes are currently lecture-style, Partridge



hopes to include more discussion by distributing readings before in-person class periods. Partridge enjoys having repeat students in his classes. He explains, “I had to drop my own writing to start teaching classes, but this was my

opportunity to pass on what I know about Homer—that was the inspiring thing.”

In the coming sessions, Partridge hopes to inspire more students with new classes on subjects like Greek comedy and Sherlock Holmes. He looks forward to lively class discussions as community members discover more about the ancient Greeks.

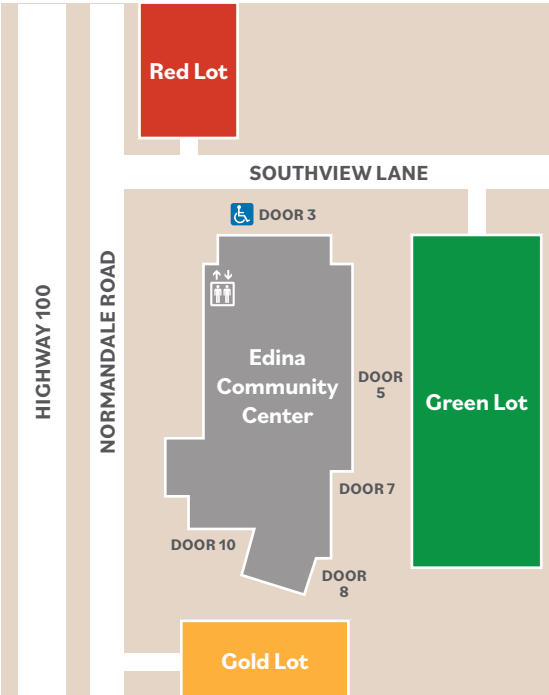
