#### YEAR GROUP UPDATES

This week has been devoted to friendship as it is National Anti-bullying Week. It was lovely to see some of the children in Early Years wearing odd socks on Monday to kickstart discussion based on celebrating differences and being unique. Plus they designed some odd socks at school, which was fun! We have shared a range of stories to encourage the children to share views and opinions about friendship, kindness and emotions. 'The Selfish Crocodile', 'Lost and Found' and 'My Friend Bear' to name a few. The children have had a lot of writing opportunities, for example writing friendship tokens, badges to give to each other, cards, friendship potions and what makes a good friend. The children are now really applying their knowledge of phonics to their reading and writing, which is wonderful. Many of you are sharing some great successes at home too, which is always great for us to hear; that the invaluable learning continues at home, thank you. In maths we have focused on Number 5, solving number problems to five and subitising-this is where the children can tell the amount of objects, without the need to count, but just using a visual representation. An example would be rolling a die, it landing on 3 and not needing to count it's 3; this is subitising! Next week it is the class mascot's birthday, so there will be exciting party/birthday preparations in store, this offers many opportunities to write for different purposes. Have a lovely weekend.

This week Year 1 have been doing lots of addition and subtraction looking closely at fact families for numbers bonds to ten and twenty. In English we have been writing explanations for Traction Man's gadgets. We are getting good at

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these now! If an opportunity arises at home gets the children to explain how something works! What else? ...Ask the children about Human and Natural materials they can spot when and about. Puppets, we have begun practising our sewing so again if you feel inclined, practising these skills really develops hand eye coordination and fine motor skills. And History, we have been looking at toys form the past and present. Thank you to anyone that has sent in toys, there is still time for us to share your toys with the class so we welcome anything anyone has to offer! Have a great weekend.

Happy Friday! This week in English, our year 2's transformed into investigative journalists, breaking the gripping story of the Titanic's sinking in the chilly North Atlantic! From crafting catchy headlines to sketching vivid scenes and adding captions, they've truly mastered the art of newspaper reports. Word problems were the focus in maths and the children used manipulatives and pictorial representations to solve it! It's been a heart-warming Anti-Bullying Week too, with our children learning to recognise, speak out, and reach out against bullying. Science brought Arctic adventures as we explored the cool world of Arctic animals and their nifty adaptations. In RE, we delved into the spirit of Christmas, discovering how Christians celebrate the birth of Jesus. In Reading, more children were introduced to 'Destination Reader'. It involves daily reading sessions which incorporate whole class modelling and the children then applying these skills through partner work and independent reading. Children get the opportunity to deepen their understanding of the texts they read through the systematic use of a series of strategies and language stems. Phew, what a week! Wishing you all a fantastic weekend.

Year 3 have had another busy week. Congratulations to Cedar class on performing their first assembly last week; it was wonderful! We loved seeing all the odd socks arriving in classes on Monday and the children loved designing their own! It was a great start to anti- bullying week. In English we are continuing with 'A Boy Called Christmas,' and the children have been using excerpts from the book to put in to speech bubbles and practise using inverted commas for direct speech. They have enjoyed exploring newspapers: we have looked at the different features and they have written their own captions to go with pictures and headlines. Next week they will be planning and writing their own newspaper report about a missing boy (Nikolas). In maths we have continued to try different strategies for subtraction and addition: the children have worked so hard at this! We are really proud of them. In science we have been learning about the skeletal system; the children labelled a diagram of the skeleton then labelled each others bones using post it notes. Have a good weekend everyone.

Year 4 have had another busy week. We started the week with an assembly to launch Anti-Bulling week. The children have discussed what bullying looks like and what they can do to help someone if they are being bullied. We also created a lovely friendship wreath which celebrated each child. In English, we have been examining letter writing. This week we have focused on informal letters and next week we will be looking at formal letters. The children have been writing letters from Magnus (the main character in our book) to his friend Cedric. In maths, we have continued learning ways to solve calculations mentally. Although some have found this challenging, all have shown a great determination to achieve. During science we have continued to learn about states of matter -the focus this week has been on condensation and evaporation. We have set up an experiment linked to the focus which we will monitor over the next couple of week. In history we have been continuing to build on our learning linked to the Anglo-Saxons. This week we have been finding out about the 7 kingdoms and how Anglo-Saxon fought to defend and take land. In geography the children discovered how rivers are formed and some key vocabulary linked to this. We hope you all have a lovely weekend and that you are able to enjoy the small bit of sunshine forecast.

Week 3 done! Wow! This term is just flying by. This week, Year 5 started to read our new book called 'Once'. The story follows the journey of a young boy called Felix, who leaves an orphanage to find his parents. In English, we have been learning about biographies and this week we have researched Anne Frank. Next week, we will write a biography about her. In maths, we have moved on from mental strategies to the written method for addition. In PSHE, we have discussed Anti-bullying week and rumours. In history, we completed our first lesson on the Holocaust. In RE, we learnt about Shabbat. On the 5<sup>th</sup> December, we are planning to have a Victory in Europe Day (VE Day) celebration. This will celebrate the end of WWII. We would like the children to dress in the clothing they wore for the Tenterden trip (1940s style) and bring in some food. More information will follow shortly. Don't forget to login to rollama and times tables rock stars. See you Monday.

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This week Year 6 have been working hard in English, planning and writing a balanced argument all about whether animals should perform in circuses. We have been using complex conjunctions like 'however', 'on the other hand' 'alternatively' to flit from one side of the debate to the other. Ask your child what side of the debate they are on and why? In maths we have started our big unit covering fractions, we have been revising what a fraction is, how we represent them visually and simplifying fractions. We've also been practising our arithmetic skills through more regular tests and we're very proud of how much fast progress is being made! In geography the children have been busy researching their own North American countries and their capital cities. This ended up a bit of a project where they researched one capital city in detail. In science we have continued to investigated pulse rate, looking at how important it is to keep our hearts healthy. In Music we're continued to rock out to rock music genre and we listened to a rock music podcast where we learned what 'shredding' on a guitar was, and where rock music originated. We thank all of you parents for your patience regarding all of the rescheduling of our street art walks due to these wet weather conditions, we hope in the next week all 3 classes will finally experience the wonderful decorated sights of Hastings fingers crossed the weather stays dry for us!
