Victory Parent Literacy Night

K-3rd Grade Parents-

Mark Your Calendars! We're excited to invite you to attend one of our upcoming parent literacy nights (September 25 & 26). These are opportunities for you to take a greater role in your K-3 student's education, especially how to access the Istation web-based learning program at home. This is one of the tools we use at school to develop your students' literacy proficiency. By helping your child at home, your student will see even greater results at school! If you're concerned that maybe you don't have adequate computer skills to support your child, that's what these nights are for! In addition to literacy, we'll also touch on other areas of your child's education. The literacy nights will be held on Monday, Sept. 25, at 6:00 pm and again on Tuesday, Sept. 26, at 7 pm in the Victory Computer Lab. Each session will last less than an hour and are identical in content. (Please note: What your child will learn at home with Istation are supplementary lessons and are not to be mistaken as replacements for the direct instruction your child receives every day in the classroom from his or her teacher.)

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

The USDA Food & Nutrition program has an online cookbook for family meals. Called, **Recipes for Healthy Kids: Cookbook for Homes**, the recipes feature foods both children and adults should consume more of: dark green and orange vegetables, dry beans and peas, and whole grains. All of the recipes are low in total fat, saturated fat, sugar and sodium, and they've been kid-tested and kid-approved! Required College & Career Guidance Notice to Parents: Victory provides college and career advising to its 7th-12th grade students in a variety of ways. For 8th graders, the high school registrar helps students prepare their high school four-year plan. 7th-8th graders also complete weekly the State-required First Steps College & Career exploration course, which occurs throughout the year during their scheduled computer labs. These assignments are reviewed by the high school Life Skills/apprenticeship teacher in preparation of the 7th-8th-graders moving into high school. At the high school level, the high school registrar, apprenticeship coordinator, and teachers take part in college and career advising through such activities as one-on-one college & career advising, apprenticeships/career exploration, completion of a college binder their junior year (which includes completing college applications). High School students must also complete the Life Skills class. Daily, at the beginning of every high school class, Core Knowledge and SAT prep questions are reviewed. College representatives also visit the school. Victory's state-approved, College and Career Advising and Mentoring Plan can be found on Victory's website, www.victorycharterschool.net under the Parent Involvement tab. The 2023-2024 Title IA and Families-in-Transition powerpoint presentation, which will be shared during the Barnyard Bash/Open House on September 15 is also available for viewing on the school's website at www.victorycharterschool.net under the Parent Involvement tab.
