PARENT INVOLVEMENT

New website for families in need: The website, www.findhelpidaho.org, helps those needing to connect to various supports in our community. Financial assistance, food pantries, medical care, and other free or reduced cost help can be accessed by visiting and entering your zip code.

Idaho's Homelessness response system: Idaho has a standardized approach to homelessness response to address the needs of those experiencing a housing crisis, to help them gain access to programs & services, and to ensure those experiencing or at risk of homelessness that are seeking long-term housing solutions have consistent access to housing resources. In particular, individuals in need of housing assistance now have one, regional access point to work with -- for the Nampa area this is the Salvation Army, [403 12th Ave S, Nampa, 208-467-6586](http://www.salvationarmy.org). Those in need of immediate shelter should continue to access emergency shelters, such as Nampa's Valley Women & Children's Shelter, 208-475-0725; and Lighthouse Men's Shelter, 208-461-5030. The school's homeless liaison is also available to assist in sharing & coordinating these resources. Contact the school office if you're in need of such assistance.

Title IA/Youth-in-Transition Parent Meeting: During the Fall Barnyard Bash on Sept. 15 we will hold the required, annual Title IA/Youth-in-Transition parent meeting. Please be sure to sign in when you visit your child's classroom so that we have documented that this session was held. In the coming weeks, information shared on Sept. 15 will also be distributed via our weekly parent newsletter and school website, along with other annually-required federal programs information.

Student Attire

Please review the following policy information regarding student clothing. All guidelines apply to both male and female students. Shorts, skirts, and dresses must be no more than 3 inches above the top of the knee cap. Shirts and tops must cover the shoulders; no tank tops or shirts with armholes open below the armpit area. Tops must have a neckline higher than the straight line from underarm to underarm and must reach below the belt-line to cover the stomach. Tops must conceal undergarments (no sheer or see-through portions that don't meet the previous criteria). These guidelines apply to all students, K-12. Thank you for reviewing your student's attire before they come to school each day to ensure it meets these standards.
