

Thank you to all who attended!













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








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St. Helens High School students selected for Western International Band Clinic's high school honor bands and All-State Honor Bands!

DURHAM SCHOOL SERVICES TRANSITIONING TO BUSZONE MOBILE APP

BusZone

Students riding the school bus will be sent home with flyers from Durham School Services notifying parents that they will be transitioning from the BusTracker mobile app to BusZone mobile app. This easy-to-use mobile app allows you to check on your student(s) school bus at any time.

Lighten your daily load.

Raising children is a tough job. This easy-to-use mobile app allows you to check on the school bus whenever you want.

Set up BusZone:

- 1. Download the BusZone app from the App Store or Google Play.
- 2. Enter the above School Access Code.
- In the search field, enter the bus or route number you want to follow. Complete this step for all the buses your students ride throughout the week.
- 4. Enter your child's unique student ID.
- 5. Create alert zones around drop-off and pick-up points.

When your child's bus enters an alert zone, you will receive notification by email or text.

Trust that your information is secure.

Security is priority one, especially where student information is concerned. All parent/ guardian information is locked down and password protected within the app to prevent unauthorized people from opening the app and viewing the child's bus information.
