Hendricks Behavioral Hospital offers a full continuum of care through our inpatient and intensive outpatient programming for individual experiencing substance use disorders. We offer adult medically managed detoxification services for substances such as alcohol, benzodiazepines, fentanyl and opiates with an accompanying mental health disorder. Our inpatient stays are between 7 to 10 days and vary according to the individual's needs. Patients will receive evidence based programming called Seeking Safety. We also offer a variety of recreational therapies during the stay including: pet therapy, music therapy, art therapy, yoga, health management and anger management.

As part of the process, we offer Intensive Outpatient Programs (IOP) for individuals. This is a good step-down for inpatient patients or designed for individuals who may need more than traditional one on one therapy. IOP is offered 5 days per week for 3 hours at a time.

Our hospital offers 24/7 free assessments to determine level of care needed. No appointment is ever needed. We accept Indiana Medicaid, HiP, Presumptive Eligibility Medicaid for inpatient stays, Medicare for inpatient, most commercial insurance, TriCare and self-pay. 
