Superintendent's Report - Board of Education Meeting - April 19, 2016 - 7:00 p.m.

Ambitious Instruction – Classes are academically demanding and engage students by emphasizing the application of knowledge.

- Teachers continue to make use of available tools to extend the classroom setting and to create new and authentic learning opportunities for our students (4th and 7th graders Skyping with authors as an example)
- The Gower Admin Team recommends adoption of policy 6:185 <u>Remote Educational Program</u> to increase enhancement/enrichment opportunities for qualifying students in concert with our i³ Learning Initiative
- Students in the GM Teen Leadership class have been invited to participate in an upcoming teacher training
- Registration for our 2016 summer programs continue (currently, 70+ students registered in our new STEM camps, and 35+ in our Step Up program; likely to outpace last year's participation)

Supportive Environment – The school environment is safe, clean and conducive to student learning. Teachers have high expectations for students. Students have the support of their teachers as well as their peers.

- Year to Date attendance rates (*Previous Year*): 96.0% (95.6%) for our 888 (842) students; 96.4% (96.1%) for our 80 (72) Certified Staff and 96.9% (96.4%) for our 67 (65) Non-Certified Staff. Goal = 97%+
- 3rd Qtr. Discipline Reports indicate that our schools remain on pace to reduce the total number of student referrals from the previous school year despite a slight increase in referrals from the 2nd Qtr (Appendix A)
- Hinsdale students (peer leaders) met with 8th graders at GM on 4/7 to discuss the transition to high school
- Required staff trainings (School Safety & Review of Required Drills) were held during March faculty meetings at respective schools and led by Gower staff. Required annual trainings are complete for 2015-16
- Facilities Update: Plans continue for the GM Courtyard Renovation Project 2016

Involved Families and Community – Strong relationships are built across the community to support learning.

- Kindergarten Registration for the 2016-2017 continues (64 new Gladiators have registered to date²)
- In their first year competing in the <u>National History Bee</u>, 7/10 GM students advanced to the Regional Finals (4/5). Four of our students qualified to compete at the National Final in Chicago (June 9-12)
- The Gower PTO Celebration of the Arts Fair was held at GM on 3/14 from 5:00 8:30 p.m. showcasing the tremendous talents of our students and the incorporation of art into the curriculum
- Gower will celebrate Multicultural Week from April 18-22. Please join us at GW on April 20th for our Multi-Cultural Storytelling time led by Gower students as well as a special, storytelling guest (5:30-8:00 pm)
- A number of students from GW & GM will display their work at the <u>WSCAE Student Art Expo</u> (4/23)
- Legislative Update: With both chambers of the Illinois General Assembly currently in session, district administrators are monitoring the progress of state school funding reform legislation as a portion of district revenues are linked to the state (in FY16, \$584,697 or ~4% of total district budget was state funded)

Collaborative Teachers and Staff – The staff is committed to the school, receives strong professional development, and works together to improve the school.

- After-school committee meetings continue and most recently included PERA, K-8 Music, K-8 Social Science, Professional Development, FACS and Summer Step Up in support of our improvement efforts
- The Parent Student Handbook Committee is scheduled to meet 4/28 to review the 2016-17 Handbook
- Gower West has been selected by the <u>Flippen Group</u> from a pool of several hundred school campuses as 1 of 5 National Showcase Schools and a model for the effective implementation of Capturing Kids' Hearts
- Teacher Inservice on 4/20 will focus on Capturing Kids' Hearts and will be led by Gower Process Coaches **Effective Leaders** School leaders work with staff to implement a clear and strategic vision for school success.
 - The 2016-17 registration process for returning students is underway with no increase to student fees
 - Preliminary FY17 budgets have been presented to the BOE for O & M and Transportation
 - District local revenue projections for FY17 were within 0.1% of the final 2015 property tax levy and extension from the DuPage County Clerk. The \$12,751,504 tax extension represents ~90% of total revenue
 - The selection process to fill our four (4) anticipated teacher vacancies in 2016-17 is well underway with final recommendations for new candidates expected ahead of our July 1st target date
