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Superintendent's Report - Board of Education Meeting - February 20, 2018 - 7:00 p.m.

Ambitious Instruction – Classes are academically demanding and engage students by emphasizing the application of knowledge.

- MOY (Middle of Year) NWEA/MAP testing in Reading and Math is complete for students in grades K-8 and mid-year growth data indicates high levels of attainment and growth in both subject areas (Appendix A)
- 2016 and 2017 Illinois Science Assessment results (grades 5 and 8) have been received and are being reviewed for program evaluation (Appendix B)
- An update of the GM foreign language program and student course selection process is being provided to the Board with a recommendation to continue the current student choice/elective model (Appendix C)
- Invites for Summer Step Up will be sent home next week for targeted support in Reading and Math (K-7)
- The 2018 Caudill Challenge at Gower Middle included students (and staff) reading a total of 1,051 books from the list, and 16 of our students (plus 3 staff members) finished all 20 of the nominated titles.

Supportive Environment – The school environment is safe, clean and conducive to student learning. Teachers have high expectations for students. Students have the support of their teachers as well as their peers.

- Year to Date attendance rates (*Previous Year*): 95.3% (95.6%) for our 898 (874) students; 96.5% (96.4%) for our 81(83) Certified Staff and 96.3% (97.0%) for our 68 (72) Non-Certified Staff. Goal = 97%+
- Required staff trainings (Testing Protocols for PARCC and CogAT) were held during Feb. faculty meetings at respective schools and led by Gower principals
- Special Education staff at both schools hosted a Lunch and Learn (GM: 2/8 and GW: 2/15) on Autism and best practice strategies to support our autistic students in the classroom
- Facilities with the anticipated retirement of our Buildings Grounds & Transportation Director on 6/30 the position was posted on our school website (<u>link</u>) The district is also looking to hire bus drivers (<u>link</u>)

Involved Families and Community – Strong relationships are built across the community to support learning.

- Based on parent feedback collected a recommendation to leave the current start times for our schools unchanged for 2018-19 is being made to the Board for approval at the April 17th meeting (Appendix D)
- The annual 5-Essentials Survey closed 1/31 and we appreciate the parent involvement and feedback. You helped us close in on our standing goal of 35% parent participation with a rate of 33% Report to follow
- Gower has led the effort to hold the 4th Annual <u>WSCAE</u> Brookfield Zoo Science Fair (2/22) and will participate along with 12 local school districts from West Suburban Consortium of Academic Excellence
- The District's Annual Science Showcase and STEM Challenge (gr. 4-8) is rescheduled for March 1 at GM
- The Gower PTO Winter Family Dance held at GW on Feb 2 was a success and attended by ~350 people
- The PTO Fun Fair is scheduled for March 9th (5:30 8:30) at GM Please join us for some fun!

Collaborative Teachers & Staff – The staff is committed to the school, receives strong professional development, & works together to improve.

- The Board of Education and the Gower Education Association report that they are "on-track" in terms of the <u>Collective Bargaining Timeline</u> and continue to negotiate current <u>CBA</u> issues
- After-school committee meetings continue to meet and most recently include District Mentoring, STEM Challenge/Science Showcase, Multicultural Event Planning, INNOVATE 62, Gower Reads, and K-8 Art in support of school/district improvement efforts
- Gower staff will present at the upcoming conference at ICE (Illinois Computing Educators) and members of the INNOVATE 62 Committee will also attend the conference for professional learning
- Gower teachers and administrators are hosting monthly Lunch and Learns utilizing Title II grant funds on topics such as Tech Integration, Best Instructional Practices, Special Education, and Innovator's Mindset

Effective Leaders – School leaders work with staff to implement a clear and strategic vision for school success.

- The 3rd Annual "Freshman Readiness Survey" was administered in collaboration with D86 and local feeder districts and the data indicate a high degree of readiness from our most recent graduates (Appendix E)
- A recommendation for no increase in school registration fees has been provided to the Board (Appendix F)
- The district's application for \$23,040 in <u>federal E-rate</u> (technology) funding in 2018-19 has been approved
- Gower remains in the highest category of financial strength (3.65/4.0) on the 2018 ISBE Financial Profile
- A preliminary staffing plan for 2018-19 certified teaching needs is expected in March
