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Superintendent's Report - Board of Education Meeting – April 30, 2019 - 7:00 p.m.

Ambitious Instruction – Classes are academically demanding and engage students by emphasizing the application of knowledge.

- Illinois Science Assessment for grades 5 and 8 took place on April 24th through science classes
- The 5th-8th grade Course Selection Process at GM for 2019-20 is in its final stages and illustrates a continued interest in our expanded student choice and electives program implemented in 2017 (Appendix A)
- The GM Math Curriculum Committee is recommending a curricular upgrade to the new edition of Big Ideas: Modeling Real Life for grades 5-8 as part of the regular curriculum review cycle (Appendix B)
- Expanded Summer 2019 learning activities continue in partnership with <u>Indian Prairie Library</u> including: DIY Pillow (4-6), STEAM Stories (K-2), Two Online Reading Clubs (4-8), Origami Bookmarks (K-4), & Radial Name Designs (5-8) - Registration link coming soon from Indian Prairie Library

Supportive Environment – The school environment is safe, clean and conducive to student learning. Teachers have high expectations for students. Students have the support of their teachers as well as their peers.

- Year to Date attendance rates (Previous Year): 95.5% (95.1%) for our 889 (905) students; 96.4% (96.6%) for our 80 (81) Certified Staff and 97.5% (96.2%) for our 60 (68) Non-Certified Staff. Goal = 97%+
- Required staff trainings held on 4/9 focused on the topic of ADHD and was led by Gower's Social Workers
- 3rd Otr. Discipline Reports indicate that GW is on-track & GM is off-track from annual goals (Appendix C)
- GM held its first 'Gower Scholars Program' (4/22) as part of a local leadership and mentoring effort the program included a high school student panel for our current 8th graders focused on high school readiness
- Facilities GM LED Lighting Project (Phase 1) complete with anticipated annual savings of \$3,600 (energy) and \$2,400 (maintenance). Plans for GW LED Lighting Project (Phase 1) underway for spring/summer 19' Involved Families and Community – Strong relationships are built across the community to support learning.
 - The annual 5-Essentials Survey closed with parent participation rates of 34% at GW and 25% for GM missing our standing goal of 35%. Full report forthcoming as we await data set from Univ. of Chicago
 - The Gower Foundation plans to survey the community for topics to continue the Speaker Series in 2019-20
 - The Gower Board of Education held a public hearing on the topic of eLearning (4/30) An updated report was provided to the Board as part of a 4-part eLearning report series beginning Dec. 2018 (Appendix D)
 - The WSCAE Art Expo will be held 4/27 at the Chaney Mansion and will feature artwork from both schools
 - Gower was represented at Sen. Curran's inaugural Educational Advisory Committee meeting (4/17)
 - The GM Science Olympiad Team competed at the College of DuPage Regional Tournament (3/9)
 - District-wide Prevent the Summer Slide Night is being held on May 7th at GM to provide students and parents with summer at-home ideas to Grow Your Skills, Be Healthy & Safe, Make a Positive Difference

Collaborative Teachers & Staff – The staff is committed to the school, receives strong professional development, & works together to improve.

- After-school committee meetings continue and most recently included K-8 ELA, GM Foreign Language, GM Math, K-8 AT, Planning for Prevent the Summer Slide Night, Mentoring, STEM, GM Social Studies
- The Gower Parent/Teacher Advisory Committee is meeting on May 6th to discuss the 2018-2019 handbook
- <u>District PERA Committee</u> completed evaluation rubrics for the new School Counselor and Instructional & Student Support Specialist (Teacher Leader) positions being added to our certified staff roster in 2019-20
- GM Social Studies teachers and admin are watching HB2265, which has implications for a required middle school Civics Class in grades 6, 7, or 8 by 2019-2020 or, by 2020-2021, per Amendment 1 to the bill

Effective Leaders – School leaders work with staff to implement a clear and strategic vision for school success.

- GW has been recognized as a 2018-19 <u>Capturing Kids' Hearts Showcase School</u> A 4-time winner!
- Hiring recommendations for 2019-20 teacher vacancies are complete and interviews are underway for School Counselor position - An updated Staffing Plan has been provided to the Board (Appendix E)
- Final adjustments to the 2018 tax levy which will fund the 2019-20 school year was filed with the <u>DuPage</u> County Clerk's Office prior to the 3/27 deadline (final EAV values available 3/19)
- GW has been selected as an <u>IL EMPOWER</u> Peer to Peer Learning Partner (GM to apply again in May)
- Preliminary FY20 budgets have been presented to the BOE for O & M and Transportation
- District local revenue projections for FY20 were within 0.02% of the final property tax levy calculated by the <u>DuPage County Clerk</u> - The \$13,561,737 tax extension represents roughly 86% of total revenue
