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## Superintendent's Report - Board of Education Meeting - February 19, 2019 - 7:00 p.m.

**Ambitious Instruction** – Classes are academically demanding and engage students by emphasizing the application of knowledge.

- MOY (Middle of Year) NWEA/MAP testing in Reading and Math is complete for students in grades K-8 and mid-year growth data indicates high levels of attainment and growth in both subject areas (Appendix A)
- The 2019 Caudill Challenge at Gower Middle included students (and staff) reading a total of 903 books from the list, and 14 of our students finished all 20 of the nominated titles.
- Science Showcase participants in grades 5-8 will compete in the WSCAE Brookfield Zoo Science Fair on 2/21. Parents and guests are welcome to attend the fair from 11:30-12:15 pm in the Discovery Center.
- Summer Step Up and ESY Programs for targeted Gower Middle and Gower West students are being planned for June 3-27. Parents will receive a letter and registration information in the next few weeks.
- 6th gr. students completed Robert Crown's "Life Begins" program (2/15) as part of the Health Curriculum **Supportive Environment** – The school environment is safe, clean and conducive to student learning. Teachers have high expectations for students. Students have the support of their teachers as well as their peers.
  - Year to Date attendance rates (Previous Year): 95.9% (95.3%) for our 873 (898) students; 96.6% (96.5%) for our 80 (81) Certified Staff and 97.0% (96.3%) for our 60 (68) Non-Certified Staff. Goal = 97%+
  - Required staff trainings held on Feb. 12 were focused on State Testing Protocols/schedules (the new Illinois Assessment of Readiness - IAR, CogAT) and led by building principals
  - Gower will host a LADSE professional development session on Adaptive PE for the Gower Physical Education Teachers and other guest teachers on March 22<sup>nd</sup> to form a collaborative network
  - Facilities GM LED Lighting Project will begin this month. As reported in Nov., the \$16,000 Nicor Grant will be used with the recent \$3,700 ComEd Grant to heavily subsidize the ~\$21,000 energy savings upgrade

Involved Families and Community – Strong relationships are built across the community to support learning.

- The annual 5-Essentials Survey has been extended until March 15<sup>th</sup>! We encourage all Gower parents to participate. We have a standing goal of 35% parent participation and are currently at 34% GW and 25% GM
- The Gower PTO Fun Fair is scheduled for March  $8^{th}$  (5:00 8:30) at GM Please join us for some fun!
- Families may sign up to be host a food booth, informational booth, or perform during the District's Multicultural Night on Mar. 15th at Gower Middle to showcase and celebrate Gower's diversity
- Attendance for the Gower Foundation Speaker Series for February 12<sup>th</sup> was challenged by the weather but the topic of Bullying in Schools was well-received. The final part of the series is scheduled for April 17<sup>th</sup>

**Collaborative Teachers & Staff** – The staff is committed to the school, receives strong professional development, & works together to improve.

- The Calendar Committee met (1/29) and recommends adoption of the revised 2018-19 & proposed 2019-20 school calendar (Appendix B)
- Innovate 62 is leading an Instructional Bingo Challenge called "March Madness" from March 1-22 in which Teachers draw from a variety of instructional strategies that reflect our i3 Learning goals to implement
- After-school committee meetings continue and most recently included Reading Specialists Collaboration, Science Showcase/STEM Challenge, District Calendar Committee, K-8 ELA, and GM Foreign Language
- GM PE Teachers submitted an <u>IAHPERD</u> grant application for new smart heart rate monitors to be incorporated into the 2019-2020 school year.
- Gower staff will present at the upcoming conference at ICE (Illinois Computing Educators) and members of the INNOVATE 62 Committee will also attend the conference for professional learning

Effective Leaders – School leaders work with staff to implement a clear and strategic vision for school success.

- District Admin continue to share the Gower eLearning model (now used in some districts) and have collected feedback & program data to begin the evaluation process; Board update provided (Appendix C)
- GW and GM Admin and School Leadership Teams have applied to be <u>IL EMPOWER</u> 'learning partners'
- Gower Admin will complete the <u>EL Title III</u> Intent to Apply application with local partners by March 1<sup>st</sup>
- A recommendation for 2019-2020 school registration and transportation fees has been provided to the Board and includes a rate of inflation fee adjustment to the 2014-15 fee levels (Appendix D)
- A preliminary staffing plan was presented to the Board for the 2019-20 school year (Appendix E)
