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Superintendent's Report - Board of Education Meeting - March 19, 2019 - 7:00 p.m.

Ambitious Instruction – Classes are academically demanding and engage students by emphasizing the application of knowledge.

- The GM Science Olympiad Team competed (3/9) placing 5th (12 Teams) and earned the coveted Spirit Award; an honor for teams that have a positive attitude, exemplify teamwork, and exhibit sportsmanship
- <u>Illinois Assessment of Readiness IAR</u> testing will occur the week of April 8th for students in grades 3-8
- The <u>Illinois Science Assessment</u> will occur on April 24th for 5th and 8th grade students; our 2018 results indicate that 82% of 5th grade and 76% of 8th grade students are proficient (Appendix A)
- The GM Math Curriculum Committee is finalizing their recommendation and expect to complete it by April
- Summer 2019 offerings will be expanded to include a new virtual Art Club for grades 3-5 led by GW Art Staff and for grades 6-8 led by GM Art staff; more information to be sent home in school virtual backpacks

Supportive Environment – The school environment is safe, clean and conducive to student learning. Teachers have high expectations for students. Students have the support of their teachers as well as their peers.

- Year to Date attendance rates (Previous Year): 95.8% (95.2%) for our 887 (904) students; 96.4% (96.5%) for our 80 (81) Certified Staff and 97.1% (96.2%) for our 60 (68) Non-Certified Staff. Goal = 97%+
- Required staff trainings held on 3/12 were focused on 504 Plans, IDEA, and the Americans with Disabilities Act led by Gower's school psychologist (GW) and LADSE's school psychologist (GM)
- Gower paraprofessionals have a training opportunity on Mar. 22nd focused on the topic of Data Collection and Additional Effective Behavior Strategies led by LADSE's Behavior Consultant
- Facilities GM LED Lighting Project (Phase 1) complete with anticipated annual savings of \$3,600 (energy) and \$2,400 (maintenance). Plans for GW LED Lighting Project (Phase 1) underway for spring/summer 19'

Involved Families and Community – Strong relationships are built across the community to support learning.

- The annual <u>5-Essentials Survey</u> closed with parent participation rates of 34% at GW and 25% for GM missing our standing goal of 35%. Full report forthcoming as we await data set from Univ. of Chicago
- Gower celebrated its diversity at the 4th annual Multicultural Night on March 15th at GM. Culture Trivia, cultural dances performed by students and parents, and a variety of foods were enjoyed by participants
- The Gower PTO Fun Fair was well-attended and the feedback on the shortened time frame was positive
- The final part of the Gower Foundation Speaker Series has been rescheduled to April 16th (Kids and Tech)
- Kindergarten Registration for 2019-20 was held on 3/2 at GW; Student count of 60 similar to last year (-2)
- Gower was awarded \$8,000 through the Follett Challenge and was was the 2nd highest number of votes. Funds will be used to enhance our library collections. Thank you Gower Community for your support!

Collaborative Teachers & Staff – The staff is committed to the school, receives strong professional development, & works together to improve.

- The revised 2019-2020 school calendar presented to the Board (2/19) was posted to the district website (2/20) and shared in the Community Newsletter (2/21). Approval of draft recommended (Appendix B)
- The BOE and GEA continue to collaborate in preparation for formal approval of Gower's eLearning Plan
- GW & GM School Leadership Teams applied to be <u>ILEMPOWER</u> support providers for partnering school
- After-school committee meetings continue and most recently included K-8 ELL, Reading Specialists Collaboration, Professional Development, District Technology, and Innovate 62
- Institute Day (3/22) will consist of professional learning in supporting English Learners, Supporting Independence in the Inclusive Classroom & Life Readiness Framework, and Advisory planning (GM)

Effective Leaders – School leaders work with staff to implement a clear and strategic vision for school success.

- The Gower eLearning model (now used in a number of districts) continues to be updated in accordance with anticipated changes to legislation (SB28) and School Code for 2019-20 (Appendix C)
- 4th Annual High School Transition Survey was administered in collaboration with D86 and local feeder districts and the data indicate a high degree of readiness from our most recent graduates (Appendix D)
- District administrators continue to review staffing plans for the 2019-20 school year with an ongoing commitment to maximize student supports and a further consolidation of administrative functions
- The 2018-19 Non-Tenured Teacher Evaluation Cycle is complete and met the March 1st state deadline
- The 2018-19 Principal Evaluation Cycle has been completed ahead of the March 1st state deadline
