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Superintendent's Report - Board of Education Meeting - January 17, 2023 - 7:00 p.m.

Ambitious Instruction – Classes are academically demanding and engage students by emphasizing the application of knowledge.

- Mid-year NWEA MAP testing is underway with growth and progress reports expected in February
- Based on the new ISBE Social Science Standards Instructional Mandates, the GM Social Studies Committee recommends an adjustment to the scope and sequence for the 2023-2024 school year (Appendix A)
- In February, 7th and 8th gr. students are receiving instruction in mental health and depression awareness through P.E. based on programming from Erika's Lighthouse and led by Gower Staff
- GM student course selection will begin 2/10 and will include a variety of options aimed at maximizing student choice and expanding the student curriculum experience throughout middle school

Supportive Environment – The school environment is safe, clean and conducive to student learning. Teachers have high expectations for students. Students have the support of their teachers as well as their peers.

- Year to Date attendance rates: 93.0% for our 507 GW students (K-4); 95.3% for our 378 GM students; 94.8% for our 94 Certified Staff and 96.1% for our 58 Non-Certified Staff. Goal = 97%+
- Required staff trainings (Jan. 10) focused on Bullying/Anti-Violence Prevention/Peer Counseling, Anti-Violence Resolution; and Suicide for GM led by Social Workers
- Our 8th grade students and parents had the opportunity to meet with Hinsdale High School District 86 guidance counselors on Jan. 13th to build and review their 9th grade schedule
- COVID-19 Community Levels are at Medium Risk for DuPage County. Visit our COVID-19 information webpage for more information
- Facilities Update: Our Gower West Campus Project remains on-schedule to open in Spring 2023

Involved Families and Community – Strong relationships are built across the community to support learning.

- The annual 5-Essentials Survey opens on Jan. 24th. We have a standing goal of 35% parent participation and encourage all of our families to help us meet it! - Last year; 40% GW, 35% GM (state avg. 17.7%)
- The Student Council's Hearts at Work fundraising efforts resulted in a \$3,355 donation to Shop With A Cop
- Bring Your Parent to School Day on Jan. 13th at GM was attended by more than 170 parents and provided an opportunity for parents to experience a 'day in the life' through an abbreviated class schedule
- Save the Date for two district-wide events: Gower Science Showcase and STEM Night on 2/2 from 6:30-8:30 pm at GM and Gower Multicultural Night on 3/10 from 6:00-8:00 pm at GW
- Thank you for your participation in the Gower Foundation's Parent Engagement Survey to determine 'Topics of Interests' and preferred delivery for upcoming Community Engagement opportunities year
- The Gower PTO continues to support our school community and is hosting a Sock Hop at GW on 1/20
- The Gower Foundation is sponsoring an author visit for students in grades 4-8 at GM. Lindsay Currie, a local Chicago author, will be presenting to students in February

Collaborative Teachers & Staff – The staff is committed to the school, receives strong professional development, & works together to improve.

- District Committee work continues and most recently involved our Special Education Teams, Tech Team, ELL, and K-4 Math
- The Calendar Committee incorporated community feedback and revised the 2023-24 and 2024-25 school calendars for Board review and subsequent approval at the Feb. 21st Board meeting (Appendix B)
- Professional Learning on 1/13 is district-based and focused on student/staff activities to promote mindfulness/wellness and improve mental health
- Presenters from Adaptability, the Center for Creative Arts Therapy, and the Northeast DuPage Family and Youth Services were invited to facilitate break-out sessions will lead sessions for staff on 1/13
- Each of our nine Bus Drivers completed their annual Recertification Course (Jan. 9)

Effective Leaders – School leaders work with staff to implement a clear and strategic vision for school success.

- Efforts to expand relationships with university programs and potential candidates continue; e.g. Speech Language Pathologist interns this spring, GM Social Worker intern for 2023-24, Job Fair representation
- The High School Transition Survey was administered to D86 9th grade students on Jan. 11-12. Administered annually from 2015-16 through 2019-20, the survey has been reinstituted
- The administrative review process of the curriculum design, organization of instruction, current class size and bell schedule is underway for 2023-24 staffing/program recommendations expected in Feb/March
- The job link for the GW Assistant Principal, set to begin in the 2023-24 school year, opened on 12/21 and we are seeing a strong interest in the position
