












Yearbooks **CANNOT**be purchased directly

MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

Students are NOT allowed to have medication at school, this includes non-prescription medication like Advil, Tylenol, etc. All medication must be cleared through the Emerson Office, contact Sally Jenkins, our Health Room Office Professional as soon as possible.

Parents/guardians are responsible for:

- ♦ Supplying all medications/transporting medication to and from school.
- ◆ Completing required medication authorization forms. An authorization to administer medication form must be turned in for each medication whether prescription or non-prescription. The form must be signed by the health care provider and parent and/or guardian. Medication cannot be given without the completed form.
- ♦ All prescribed medication must be in the original, labeled prescription bottle, container or package.
- ♦ All non-prescription medication must be in original container and labeled by the parent, <u>including</u>: Student Name, Medication Name, Dosage, Date Issued, Name of Health Care Provider, and Time medication is to be given.

Scheduled medications are given between 11:00 AM - 1:00 PM only.

ATTENDANCE LINE


Students and parents/guardians are responsible for school attendance. Within 48 hours of an absence, the parent or legal guardian of any student who is absent from school is expected to:

- 1) Leave a phone message on the EMHS Attendance Line at 425-936-2306;
- Send an email to the Registrar/Attendance Secretary Sally Jenkins, at sjenkins@lwsd.org,;
- 3) Supply a parent/guardian or physician note; or
- 4) Leave a note on an absence notification from ParentSquare for up to 4 days after the missed day.

The parent/guardian must report the absence for students living at home, even if over 18 years old. Please call or email Sally Jenkins to notify the school in advance of pre-planned absences. For vacation or extended absences, the student may pick up a form in the office for teachers and parent/guardian to sign prior to the absence.

The LWSD is using ParentSquare for automated attendance notifications. Families will receive the absence notification through email and text first, instead of a robocall. If the system indicates families did not receive, open, or read the message or email within a certain amount of time, the robocall will go out. Parent/guardians can also leave notes on an absence through ParentSquare.

EMERSON CAMPUS SAFETY COMMITTEE



We follow district protocols to set up emergency instructions for lockdowns, fires, earth-quakes, and emergency situations which require Parent/Student Reunification. The campus safety committee also helps the campus prepare for a potential disaster by gathering and maintaining the campus emergency supplies. Most staff members hold a position in the campus Incident Command System to assist your child if an emergency occurs during school hours.

In the event of a campus emergency or area-wide disaster, the school district's automated phone system will deliver a recorded message letting parents know what to do, including instructions on early closing.

JACK KENT COOKE FOUNDDATION SCHOLARSHIP \$220,000—40 Awards!!

The Cooke College Scholarship Program is an undergraduate scholarship program available to high-achieving high school seniors with financial need who seek to attend and graduate from the nation's best four-year colleges and universities.

Each award is intended to cover a significant share of the student's educational experience – including tuition, living expenses, books and required fees. Awards vary by individual, based on the cost of tuition as well as other grants or scholarships they may receive.

Eligibility Requirements: - Applicants must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- Senior standing Plan to graduate from a U.S. high school in spring 2024.
- Fall College Enrollment Intend to enroll in an accredited four-year college beginning in fall 2024.
- GPA Earn a minimum, cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.5 or above.
- Demonstrate Unmet Financial Need We will consider applicants with family annual gross income up to \$95,000. During the selection process, the Foundation will conduct a full financial review which will take into account all income and assets of the student and the student's parents.

FREE & REDUCED MEAL APPLICATIONS — UPCOMING EXPIRATION DATE

Annual Free & Reduced applications for 2023-24 (2022-23 eligibility expired on 10/16/2023):

The Lake Washington School District highly encourages all families who think they may qualify for meal benefits to complete and submit a free and reduced application. Please go to MySchoolApps to fill out an application or visit our website Nu-trition Services for more information.

A new free and reduced application must be submitted and renewed annually. Families that previously qualified for free or reduced-priced benefits in school year 2022-2023 will need to reapply for the current school year to continue receiving these benefits. Applications from the 2022-2023 school year are set to expired on October 16, 2023. A new application must be filled out for the 2023-2024 school year.

WASHINGTON STATE HEALTHY YOUTH SURVEY

Emerson participated in the Washington State Healthy Youth Survey on October 19th in Core. The survey was given to students in grades 10 and 12. The survey included questions related to physical activity and diet, unintentional and intentional injury, substance use, sexual behaviors, abuse, risk and protective factors, and access to school-based services.



Survey results are used by schools, communities, and state agencies to plan programs to support our youth and reduce their risks.
