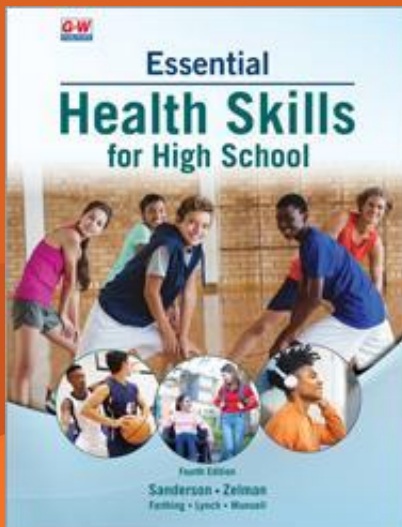


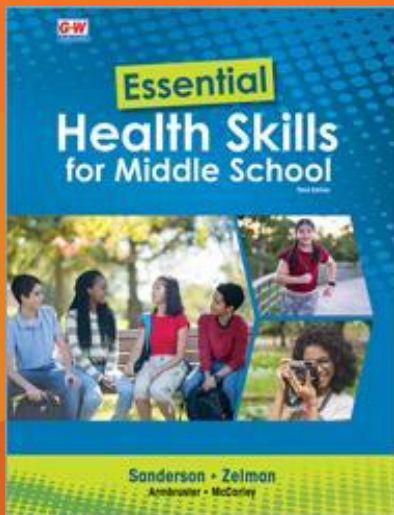
Opt out lessons:
