This Flagler Community Transition Team first came together in the school year of 2002-2003. Early on, consultants well versed in the area of adults with disabilities, guided the team in setting goals and taking action steps to create smoother transitions for students with disabilities from high school to independent and higher standards of living. The FCTT continues to set yearly goals with the intent of creating a variety of adult placement opportunities for our youth with disabilities throughout Flagler County.

The following is a checklist that may help you with your transition needs. This is only a basic guide. The important part is remembering to stay involved in the transition process to ensure that your needs and goals are addressed so you can prepare for life after high school.

<pre>Learn more about your disability, including your strengths and needs. Set goals for your future and begin developing an action plan. Discuss your diploma options and how each may affect training and work after you graduate. Meet with your school's VR counselor and invite him/her to attend your IEP meeting. Participate in planning for your future by preparing for and attending your IEP meetings. Gather transition information from your school and area agencies. Learn more about careers, interests and skills at https://www.onetonline.org/ Research employment and career opportunities by visiting your local Career Service Center, or visit http://www.floridajobs.org/ Ask about career exploration and preparation opportunities. Gain work experience and begin building your career portfolio. Apply for VR services beginning at age 15!</pre>	Continue to participate in your IEP meetings and invite VR and other agencies to attend too. Review your career goals and action plans, and update with any changes. Explore skills that will increase your career success at https://www.dol.gov/ Discuss future training, education, living, transportation, and health care options and needs required for employment. Apply for agency services, as recommended, to help you meet your post high school work needs and employment goals. Pre-register to vote at 17. Go to http://dos.myflorida.com/electio ns/for more information. Address guardianship options, if appropriate. Apply for VR services, if you haven't already!	Apply for a driver's license or state ID. Consider applying for Social Security Disability Benefits (SSI and SSDI). For information, call: (800) 772-1213 (Toll Free) or (800) 325-0778 (TTY) Consider registering to vote. If you pre-registered to vote, you will receive your registration card when you turn 18. Identify your college education/ training work skills needed to become employed. Know yourself and your needs and practice effective communication skills. If you are a male, visit sss.gov to register for selective service. If you still haven't applied, the time is NOW.
