
Act 158 of 2018 provides an outline of five distinct pathways to meet graduation requirements beginning with the graduating class of 2023.

At least one piece of evidence from the following: • Attainment of an established score on an alternate assessment: SAT Subject (630) AP (3) IB (3) • Acceptance to postsecondary institution other than 4- year accredited, non-profit higher ed institution • Attainment of industry recognized credential not associated with CTE program • Successful completion of concurrent enrollment or postsecondary course (college credit while in HS) Up to two pieces of evidence: • Community Learning Project • One Keystone proficient or advanced score • Letter ensuring full-time employment • Internship or Co-op • Compliance with NCAA core courses for collegiate student-athletes

Other Than the Pathways

In addition to the 5 pathways described above there are two (2) other provisions available.

- Graduation based on IEP team decisions based upon academic goals
- Superintendent's waiver for students with extenuating circumstances (5%)
