INSTALLMENT PAY CHANGE

As part of a statewide business system modernization, the Department of Public Instruction <u>eliminated</u> their processing of "Installment pay"; which is the method for 10-month employees to receive their salary spread over 12 months. This has been eliminated effective with the 2021-2022 school year. G.S.115C-302.1(b), requires teachers be provided an option to receive their 10 month pay in 12 monthly installments. To align with the

directions from NCDPI and state law, Craven County Schools will be providing options for 10-month employees. Please review the **Memo-Installment Pay Changes** carefully relative to installment options and the deadline of <u>July 15, 2021</u> to submit the form to receive pay over the summer months in 2022.

What Will In-Person Learning Look Like When School Starts Back in August?

We are looking forward to Craven County Schools students and staff returning to in-person learning for five days for the 2021-2022 school year. 

The flyer/handout/advertisement will be uploaded as a part of the form submission process. A **Facilities Use Form** must also be submitted for any use of school property.

Flyers/handouts/advertisements must include information for participants and parents that all safety guidelines that are in place (set by the state/Governor or school system) during the time frame of the camp will be implemented. Violations could result in the camp being closed and refunds having to be issued.

End of Year Reminders:

Researched based programming benchmarks in reading, writing and math need to be completed before EOGs for 3-12 students. K-2 programming benchmarks need to be completed before the end of the year. This information is part of the transfer information for students for Summer Learning and for next school year.

Lesson gained charts need to be updated and submitted to your Liaison by May 27th, 2021 for reading and math programming for K-12.

Itinerant staff need to submit travel to Seante Williams by May 27, 2021.

Bus Monitor Training:

Bus Monitor Training for sub monitors will be set for May 19,202. If you have new hires or subs to be trained or want to add to your sub-list, please email Lynn Hardison or Amber Gover to set up training.

As a reminder, EC buses do not roll without a trained monitor, therefore sub monitors must be trained before accepting the role to monitor a bus route. This is for the safety of all students while riding to and from school. There are 3 parts to initial bus monitor training:

Roles and Responsibilities

Specialized Seating training/video

Specialize demonstration training. All three portions must be completed before monitoring/subbing.

Information about the Summer Cash account:

Dividends: Compounded daily, credited annually on the last business day of either July or August, depending on your election. The annual percentage yield (APY) of the Summer Cash account is equivalent to the yield on a 12-month share term certificate (STC) as of August 1st of each year.

Opening Deposit: Not required

Subsequent Deposits: Automated via payroll deduction or funds transfer

Service Charge: None

How the Account Works: Funds will be transferred automatically to the share, money market share, checking or CashPoints Global account you select. These transfers will be divided equally between the unpaid months. An 11-month employee will receive the entire balance in one payment.

Closing Account Early: You may close your account at any time during the school year. There is no penalty for closing early, and accrued dividends are paid at closing. Once closed, the account cannot be reopened until the next school year.

Subsequent Years: The same account number is used in subsequent years. Each year, you may need to adjust your payroll deduction and/or transfers based on changes in your salary.

Designed for public school system, public university and community college employees who are paid 9, 10, or 11 months per year, the Summer Cash account allows you to save money during the school year from each paycheck, while earning dividends. In the month(s) you are not paid, funds from the Summer Cash account will be automatically transferred into an SECU account of your choice.

The following notification protocol will be utilized when a school is notified of a staff member or student who has tested positive for COVID-19, and the case is considered to be school impacted. Craven County Schools, in partnership with the Craven County Health Department, follows the communications guidance from the NC Department of Health and Human Services (NCDHHS).

A scnool impacted case is one in which the individual was in a school building. less than 6 feet from others for 15 minutes or longer. "Close contact" refers to the individual being less than 6 feet away from others for a total of 15 minutes or




Close contact staff members and parents of students identified as close contacts will be notified by phone directly by the school nurse. Directions on how to proceed will be provided based on guidance from the Craven County Health Department in conjunction with NC Department of Health and Human Services



Staff members and parents of students at the individual school who were not ir close contact with the individual will be notified of the school-affected positive case by the school administrator through a letter distributed by email and Black Pagad

A dashboard will be created displaying the district data of NEW positive cases. This will be updated at 5pm on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday of each
