

Snowman

1. To begin, make a slip knot and place it on the little peg (anchor peg) leaving a long tail.
2. E wrap around the loom twice, where one is lower and one is higher.
3. Starting at the last peg that was wrapped, pull the bottom loop over the peg (e knit). Continue around the loom. Push the yarn down.
4. E Wrap around the loom once at the top.
5. Repeat step 3 and 4 until it measures about 5.5 inches.
6. Wrap the yarn around the outside of the loom, 1.5-2 times, then cut. Thread the tail with a tapestry needle. Starting at the last peg, stick the tapestry needle under the stitch, lift the stitch off the peg and string down the tail. Continue doing this all the way around and pull to close gently.
7. Stuff the snowman
8. Thread the beginning tail. Insert the needle through every other loop (the loose ones). Pull tight to close the bottom of the snowman.
9. Thread the top tail again. Insert from the top down the side about 1/3 of the snowman. Wrap the yarn around 1/3 to portion off the head. Pull tight. Don't cut off the tail yet.

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Snowman Scarf

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1. Make a slip knot and place it on peg 1.
2. Double E wrap peg 2. Knit immediately.
3. Double E Wrap peg 3. Knit immediately.
4. Take the yarn behind pegs 2 and 1. Bring the yarn in front of all the pegs at the top of the loom.
5. Knit over on all 3 pegs.
6. Repeat steps 4 and 5 until the scarf measures the desired length.
7. Note pull down on scarf as you knit for it to start to look like a boa scarf.

Snowman Hat

1. Only use 12 pegs for the hat. E wrap 12 pegs, when you turn around u wrap that peg then e wrap back to the beginning. Knit over. You can continue in this manner for a folded brim or alternate between knitting a row and purling a row.
2. To make a pointed hat, place the last peg on the previous peg. Knit over.
3. E wrap the pegs with yarn. Knit over.
4. Repeat 2 and 3 until only 1 peg remains. Cut a long tail and pull the tail through the last loop.

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
