COPING KITS SUPPORT STUDENT MENTAL HEALTH

Volunteers from the local organization, CATCH (Community Action Together for Children's Health) and the District 27 PTA, recently distributed coping kits to students at Wood Oaks and Shabonee.

Coping kits offer students tangible items and written strategies to use when facing difficult emotions. The kits include sensory tools, grounding tools, and exercises for regulated breathing, relaxation, and mindfulness. They can help children learn to cope with feelings of anger, fear, and anxiety.

Research has shown that when we teach coping skills to children they are better able to pay attention in school, get along with peers, maintain friendships, and manage their emotions in difficult situations. These skills become more accessible the more they are practiced.

This is the second year that the PTA has partnered with CATCH to provide these helpful resources for our students. We are grateful for this community effort.

DISTRICT CELEBRATES 14 CONSECUTIVE YEARS OF HIGH FINANCIAL HONORS

District 27 has received the Certificate of Excellence Awards in Financial Reporting from both the Government Finance Officers Association and the Association of School Business Officials International for the 14th consecutive year. The Board of Education recently recognized Dr. Kimberly Rio Assistant Superintendent for Finance and Operations, for these significant, long-running honors.

BASKETBALL OPEN GYM AVAILABLE THROUGH SPRING





The District has found this program to be very successful. We look forward to seeing you there!


BUDGET SET FOR FY2024, REFLECTS STABILITY

The District 27 budget remains stable with the Board of Education approving a \$33 million budget for FY2024 at its meeting on September 21. The District has allocated \$300,000 toward contingencies. The District ended the 2022-2023 school year with a 56% cumulative fund balance reserve.
