# All racial and economic achievement gaps are closed

## Goal

By the end of the 2022-2023 school year, the percentage of students in each ethnic/racial group and socio-economic group who are enrolled in college credit courses (AP, CIS, CitHS, PLTW, and PSEO) will match the group with the highest percentage of enrollment.

# All students are ready for career and college

## Goal

- The percentage of White Bear Lake Area High School students who, by the end of their senior year, have completed at least 4 courses/12 credits that are potentially post-secondary credit bearing, will increase from 31%/25% to 40%/35% by June of 2023.
- The baseline data from 2019 was 31% of students completing 4 courses and 25% of students completing 12 credits.

# 2023 Result

- 29% of the students in the class of 2023 completed at least 4 AP, CIS, CitHS, or PSEO classes by the end of their senior year.
- 40% of the students in the class of 2023 earned at least 12 credits in AP, CIS, CitHS, or PSEO classes by the end of their senior year.
- We currently offer Industry Credentials for high school students in our Career Pathways courses.

Minnesota law requires the governing body of each school district to designate the locations of polling places for the following election year. It is now time for the School Board to approve polling places for the 2024 election year.

#### **RECOMMENDED ACTION:**

It is recommended that the School Board approve the Resolution Establishing Polling Places And Combined Polling Places For Certain Multiple Precincts And Designating Voting Hours For School District Elections Not Held On The Day Of A Statewide Election.

#### RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING POLLING PLACES AND COMBINED POLLING PLACES FOR CERTAIN MULTIPLE PRECINCTS AND DESIGNATING VOTING HOURS FOR SCHOOL DISTRICT ELECTIONS NOT HELD ON THE DAY OF A STATEWIDE ELECTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board (the "Board") of Independent School District No. 624 (White Bear Lake Area Schools) as follows:

1. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.11, the precincts and polling places for School District elections are those precincts or parts of precincts located within the boundaries of the School District which have been established by the cities or towns located in whole or in part within the School District. The Board hereby confirms those precincts and polling places so established by those municipalities.

2. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.11, the Board may establish combined polling places for several precincts for school elections not held on the day of a statewide election.

3. The polling places and combined polling places described in **Exhibit A** to this Resolution are hereby established to serve the precincts specified for all School District special and general elections not held on the same day as a statewide election in the calendar year

following the adoption of this resolution.

4. The Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to designate a new or different polling place in the event that a designated polling place or combined polling has become unavailable for use, or in the event of an emergency in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 204B.175.

5. As required by Minnesota Statutes, Section 204B.16, subdivision 1a, the Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to give written notice of new polling place locations to each affected household with at least one registered voter in the School District whose school district polling place location has been changed. The notice must be a nonforwardable notice mailed at least twenty-five (25) days before the date of the first election to which it will apply. A notice that is returned as undeliverable must be forwarded immediately to the appropriate county auditor, who shall change the registrant's status to "challenged" in the statewide registration system.

6. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.09, the polling places and combined polling places will remain open for voting for School District elections not held on the same day as a statewide election between the hours of 7:00 o'clock a.m. and 8:00 o'clock p.m.

7. The Clerk is directed to promptly file a certified copy of this resolution with the County Auditors of Anoka, Ramsey and Washington Counties.
