\*Leadership Academy - The leadership academy is available to any staff member who is interested in learning more about leadership

\*Calendar Committee-We want to thank everyone on the calendar committee for their input and ideas this year as we worked to put together calendars for the next two school years. \*The Strategic Plan-Teaching and Learning subcommittee met this past week to discuss our long term goals, measurable outcomes and immediate action steps.

\*The Miami Valley CTC is 93% complete and it will be done by the end of December except for paving work that will be done in the spring.

## **SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT**

- \*The girls' soccer team has advanced to the third round of the OHSAA tournament. This young team is gaining some valuable tournament experience.
- \*I attended the drama production of *The Greek Mythology Olympiaganza*. We have incredible talent and it is great to see them on stage sharing their talents.

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- \*The band received a 1 rating last week at a competition held in Ohio Stadium. A 1 is the highest rating, so the band is wrapping up an outstanding season.
- \*The career day experiences continued last week at Northwood.
- \*Union hosted a Shoes for the Shoeless event. High school students from Northmont, Centerville, and Bellbrook helped the students and the many adults the organizers brought to the event.
- \*This week the high school students will have many options to meet with college and career pathway representatives.
- \*Annual flu shots were offered to staff on October 12, 2023. According to HS School Nurse Vickie Moody, about 200 doses were administered.
- \*We continue to highlight safety measures with a project at the KELC. The expansion of the playground and the new parking lot raised a concern we wanted to address. The proximity of the parking lot and the playground equipment warranted a fence to be installed between the two to promote safety. This work has been completed and we feel our students are more secure and that is always a top priority.
- \*Sheree Coffman and I will present on Thursday at a virtual national conference with other Purple Star schools. Our topic is Building a Community of Support for Military Families. \*The Academic Challenge Team is 40-5. We have won 3 out of the 5 tournaments we have

participated in and have not lost to an Ohio school.
