- Spelling words are provided weekly and spelling test are given every Friday (make sure your child practice writing their words 5 times each when they get home)
- Have your child practice their multiplication facts 1-9 daily
- Ensure your child gets to school on time and does not miss more than 15 days of school possible retention for numerous absences
- Enroll your child into tutoring



Arrival: Student arrival time every day is 7:50AM and may enter through the playground area (Door 2). Students are marked tardy by 8:05AM.


