Alamo College: Dual Course Enrollment

Fall 2023 Semester

Step 1: **Complete Apply Texas application for enrollment by March 3, 2023. Let your counselor know that you plan to take Dual Credit classes with Alamo College when you meet about next year's classes.**

- Apply Texas applications can be completed on campus **February 15 and 16** in Library Lab A at Tivy. Use the QR code to sign up. Alamo College will have a representative to assist students.
- You may also complete the Apply Texas application on your own by the deadline: **March 3, 2023** (email Mrs. Michalek for application step-by-step guide).



Step 2: **Complete the Dual Consent Form.**

- This form will be available outside Mrs. Michalek's office for pick up.
- The dual consent must have all signatures.

Step 3: **If you do not have qualifying PSAT, SAT, or ACT scores (email Mrs. Michalek to check), you must register to take the TSIA2. See Mrs. Riederer in the counseling office to sign up. Cost is \$15 (payable in Skyward Fee Management).**

- Students will receive an email with their ACES account login information 2 to 5 days after their application has been processed. **Once you have an ACES account, complete the AlamoENROLL modules before taking the TSIA2.**
- **Tivy TSIA2 testing dates will be February 23, March 23, and April 20.** The test will take approximately 2 ½ to 4 hours.
- English 1301/1302 requires a specific score on the TSIA2. Students who do not meet this standard will retest in May.

English 1301(Fall) and 1302(Spring)

Freshman Composition 1 and 2

- Seniors
- 6 hours of college credit
- 1 high school credit of English IV.

ITSW 1301 (Fall) and ITSW 1304 (Spring)

Introduction to Word Processing and Introduction to Spreadsheets

- Students enrolled in BIM
- 6 hours of college credit
- 1 high school credit of Business Information Management (BIM)

ACCT 1303 (Spring 2024)

This is an introduction to Accounting I.

- All application steps must be completed by September 29, 2023.
- Students enrolled in Acct 1
- 3 hours of college credit
- 1 high school credit of Accounting 1

ACCT 1304 (Spring 2024)

This is an introduction to Accounting software and programs.

- All application steps must be completed by September 29, 2023.
- Students enrolled in Acct 2
- 3 hours of college credit
- 1 high school credit of Accounting 2

Schreiner University: Dual Course Enrollment

Anatomy & Physiology

This course will count for a Biology Science credit for 3 college credit hours and 1 high school advanced science credit.

Step 1: Pick up an application from Mrs. Michalek. Let your counselor know that you plan to apply for the Dual Credit Anatomy & Physiology class when you meet about next year's classes.

Step 2: Complete and submit Schreiner Application by April 28, 2023, to Mrs. Michalek. Application requires qualifying SAT or ACT scores and recommendation letters. You will need to plan ahead to have all requested information and items by the application deadline.

Step 3: Submit \$25 application fee with completed application. Make sure that your parent/guardian has signed the completed application.

On-Ramps/The University of Texas: Dual Course Enrollment

Computer Science (3 college credit hours, 1 high school credit)

US History (6 college credit hours, 1 high school credit)

Pre-Calculus (3 college credit hours; 1 high school credit)

Statistics (3 college credit hours)

Chemistry (4 college credit hours)

On Ramps courses have a \$45 fee that is charged to students for every 3 college credit hours. Students may NOT drop an On Ramps course, so thoughtful consideration should be made when selecting this dual credit option.

You only need to let your counselor know that you are planning to take an On Ramps course when you meet about next year's classes. There are no other steps to take until the class begins in August.

Other Information:

- Students who enroll in dual courses will receive high school credit as well as college hours. They are enrolled at Tivy High School and either Alamo College, Schreiner University, and/or University of Texas systems.
- Students must apply and meet TSIA2 or SAT requirements to be enrolled in certain dual courses.
- Students who receive a D for Alamo Colleges at the semester, will be removed from all dual courses regardless of the other grades.
- Courses with Alamo College and Schreiner University that are dropped after the Census Date will show up as a dropped class on the permanent college transcript.
- Grades earned go on the college transcripts.* To transfer hours to another college, students must request a transcript from the college or university. It is up to the receiving college if they accept the course for credit.
- Core dual courses (such as English IV) earn weighted points towards a student's GPA for their high school transcript. Elective dual courses do not count towards a student's GPA. For questions regarding GPA and rank, please refer to the Tivy High School course catalog or ask our counseling department.

*UT OnRamps courses allow students to choose to accept college credit at the end of the course.
