Re: School Health Advisory Council Activity Report for 2018-2019

Texas Education Code directs the local School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) to submit an annual report to the board of trustees as an explanation of the SHAC's activities during the school year. Below is a description of the activities of the Kerrville ISD SHAC in 2018-2019.
