Parent-teacher meetings will be scheduled at any time, as requested by parents. Every effort is made to translate parent notifications or documents. Meeting translators are provided upon request. Mrs. Hooper is our Lawndale translator on campus daily.
 - Coordinating parent and family engagement activities with other federal, state, and community programs, including preschool and district after-school programs including clubs.
 - Providing educators, school leaders, and other school staff with opportunities to strengthen their knowledge and skills to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents and families as partners in student achievement and school improvement.
 Parents have an opportunity to provide input on the school wide program plan.
