Homework	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Students should expect homework nearly every class period. Assignments will involve readings and note taking from a college level textbook. Students are responsible for any material covered in the reading, even if the material is not covered in class. ● Homework will also include analysis of primary and secondary source documents, essay planning and writing, preparing for academic discussions in class, and other classroom activities. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● An average of 1-2 assignments per week are given to be completed outside of class. ● On average there will be one project per unit assigned requiring some outside of class work.
Rigor	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● The purpose of this course is to prepare students for the AP European History Exam. ● The course uses a college level textbook. ● AP European history covers from 1500 - present day. The course moves quickly and students are independently responsible for some material. ● Students will think critically in order to analyze key events in European history. ● Students will demonstrate proficiency through analysis of documents, class discussion, short answer questions, long essay questions, and document based essay questions. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● This class is designed to increase student's ability to think critically and develop a response to a question while supporting it with evidence.
