REQUESTING A TRANSCRIPT?

All transcript requests can be made by contacting our registrar, Deana Thom, by email at dthom@usd232.org.

ALWAYS include the name of the college or office the transcript is to be sent to, along with a full mailing address.

Please allow two weeks from your request for the college to receive and process.

Federal Student Financial Aid Programs

The U.S. Department of Education has three basic categories of student aid in the form of grants, work-study programs and loans. These federal programs can help a student afford to attend a post-secondary vocational technical program, community college or four-year university. Federal aid can help pay for educational expenses such as tuition and fees, room and board, books and supplies, transportation, and more!

Grant money is based on the student's financial need and typically does not have to be repaid. Work-study programs allow students to work part time on (or sometimes off) campus while attending school and these funds do not have to be repaid. Loans from the federal government must be repaid but generally have low, fixed interest rates.

Changes to the FAFSA for the 2024-2025 year only!!!

For the academic year 2024-2025 year ONLY you will not be able to submit FAFSA until December. This is due to the form shortening and changes being made.

- The date will remain October 1 for every year after
- You no longer need tax documents. All information is automatically accessed through an IRS Database (FADDX)
- Parents and students will need FSA ID from **studentaid.gov** (typically 3-5 days before applying) and SSN to apply

FEATURED SCHOLARSHIPS

The Henry W. Bloch Scholars Program and the Marion H. Bloch Scholars Program

These scholarships provide full tuition and fees for up to five years at UMKC! These awards are available to ALL students entering a standard undergraduate program, not just those planning to enter the Bloch School. They're also not just for Missouri students - Kansas students from Johnson and Wyandotte counties are also eligible.

Henry W. Bloch Scholars Program

The Henry W. Bloch Scholars Program was created for local students with a determination to succeed, regardless of their finances, test scores or life circumstances. It does not require a certain GPA, ACT score or class rank to apply.

To be considered for the program students must:

- Live in one of these five area counties: Clay, Jackson and Platte in Missouri, and Johnson and Wyandotte in Kansas
- Submit FAFSA and demonstrate financial need
- Plan to enroll full time to earn a four-year degree in a standard undergraduate program (students entering professional programs are not eligible)
- Be unable to receive other scholarships due to academic performance and/or life circumstances

Marion H. Bloch Scholars Program

This scholarship supports local students with achievements in academics, leadership and community engagement. To be considered for the program, students must:

- Live in one of these five area counties: Clay, Jackson and Platte in Missouri, and Johnson and Wyandotte in Kansas
- Have an ACT score of 25 or above and a core GPA of 3.6 or above OR have a 3.75 Core GPA or above
- Demonstrate leadership and/or involvement in community engagement activities
- Plan to enroll full time in a standard undergraduate program (students entering professional programs are not eligible)
- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident

Mill Valley Booster Club Scholarship

Each year, the Mill Valley Booster Club gives twelve \$500 scholarships to MVHS seniors whose parent(s)/guardians are members of the Booster Club. The 2024 scholarship application will be posted on the MV Booster Club Site on February 1, 2024. The submission deadline will be March 29, 2024. Scholarship requirements: Student must be a MVHS Senior. Student must have a 3.0 GPA. Parent(s)/guardian must be a Booster Club member by December 21, 2023. Student must plan to attend a 2 or 4 year university, vocational or technical school.

RUDD FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

Making a positive impact in the world through social initiatives and a fullride scholarship program for high-achieving students. There are forty 4 year full ride scholarships available. Scholarship eligibility:

- Must have a cumulative, unweighted high school GPA of 3.0 or above;
- Graduating high school in 2024 and will enroll full time in the fall;

 - Must be a US Citizen
 - Must reside in the state of Kansas
- Must be admitted and will attend either Emporia State, For Hays
 State, Kansas State, or Wichita State.

SEDC Career Ready Scholarship

The Shawnee Economic Development Council Career Ready Scholarship provides financial assistance in the amount of \$1,000 to graduating Shawnee high school seniors seeking a career in construction or construction trades such as electrical, plumbing, HVAC, carpentry, or other related professions. A successful applicant must identify either trade school where they will continue their education or acceptance of direct employment by a licensed Kansas City metro area contractor. Financial award must be used to cover costs related to tuition, books, fees, tools and/or equipment related to the construction industry. Awardees will be paired with a SEDC Scholar mentor who will assist with selection of tools and supplies required to be work ready on first day of employment. For more information go to this link


