

**Regulation 7410R**

**Students**

**DISTRICT SPONSORED EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

Student clubs, athletic teams, and other organizations may receive District sponsorship when their purposes and activities are consonant with the District's educational mission and with a culture which supports that mission. To receive and maintain District sponsorship, such organizations must adhere to the criteria set forth below:

1. All organizations must have at least one adult advisor or coach, a treasurer (where funds are involved), and other officers or advisors as needed. Advisors must be approved and appointed by the building principal. Coaches will be appointed by the Athletic Director.
2. Organization must be open to all students, regardless of race, sex, national origin or any other arbitrary criteria.
3. To obtain District sponsorship, a new organization must submit a description of the proposed organization to the building principal, who will review and forward it to the Superintendent with a recommendation. The Superintendent may approve or deny the proposal. The proposal will minimally include a description of:
  - a. The purposes and goals of the organization.
  - b. The student offices and governing structure of the organization, if any.
  - c. The type of activity or activities the organization will engage in.
  - d. The name of the adult advisor(s)
4. Any activity that involves fund raising and/or expenditure will strictly follow the procedures set forth under law and policy by the District Treasurer and the Extraclassroom Central Treasurer.
5. The adult advisor is responsible to the building principal and will serve as a liaison between the organization and the principal. (Coaches are responsible to the Athletic Director.) The advisor will also counsel and advise students, will supervise students at all organization activities, and will ensure that activities remain consonant with the purposes of the organization and the mission of the District.

Organizations which become inactive, which engage in activities outside their stated and approved purposes, which disrupt the orderly conduct of the educational program, or which violate the law or the rights of others may have their District sponsorship revoked by the Superintendent upon recommendation from the building principal.

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
