Notes:

- Meeting with superintendent- the forward movement of the district is: Dignity and Unity. She will be visiting Nibley in Feb.
- Minutes of the last meeting were accepted.
- SCC meeting are the 4th Thursday of the month from 3:45-4:45
- Letter about where our off-site shelter place was sent home with report cards. Also added to Mrs. Battle's newsletter and on the school website.
- Viewed the Budget- there is overlap due to COVID which helps to pay for some teachers.
- Land Trust- \$50,402 pays for ½ of the science teacher. Schools receive approximately 95% of Land trust funds and the amount is based on enrollment numbers from October 1st. We had 347 students on the day but are now up to 350+.
- In school family nights are paid out of the Parent Involvement budget.
- Paraprofessionals- the number of paras hasn't changed but budgets have. Computer lab and PE are both 40 hours instead of 29 ½.
- Boundary changes- will happen when schools are closed. If numbers increase, budgets increase. Board will vote in January.
- Willow- ran mental health screeners on 8th grade, which increased the case load. About 30% of students show up as needing extra help. 7th will be screened next, then 6th.

- Middle school went to the CTE job fair at the Mountain American Expo Center.
- Tutoring- many teachers are offering after school tutoring for students, in almost every grade level.
- Family night- first- Nov. 8th @ Zupas. The next will be in January. Trying to find some local establishments to support. Food-truck round-up was suggested. Possibly a family night at "Get Air."
- Halloween parade-outside, following a pattern.
- SCC Training- we watched during the meeting. Rule of order procedures need to be put in writing- Frances and Hope will do this before Winter Break. We will submit that we have completed the training.
- Acadience testing will be given on December 15th. Information about results will be shared in the January meeting.
- Quarter 2- hope squad and crossing guards will get up and running. Crossing guards do help with keeping students from getting hit by drivers going too fast. Mrs. Battle continues to ask parents to slow down in her newsletters and calls. It seems to be improving slightly.
