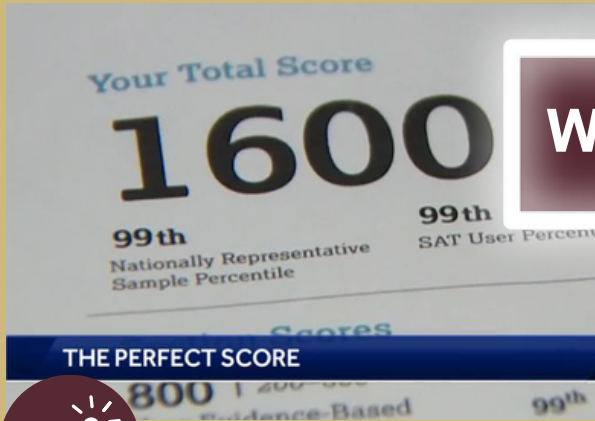

Where do we find them?

Your student should have created a *personal account* at the College Board Web Site. To view their scores, have your Student "Sign In" at the [College Board Site](#).

If your student can NOT remember their Account Password, please DO NOT create a Second Account. Instead have them Click "Reset Password" and follow the instructions.



Once they Sign in they can Explore:

- **CAREERS:** Explore careers that your student is passionate about on [BigFuture](#) by taking the [Career Quiz](#) and learning how their test performance aligns to 1,000's of occupations with The College Board's *Career Readiness Indicator*.
- **COLLEGES:** Search over 3,000 college profiles on [BigFuture](#) to discover which colleges and programs are right for your student. Filter by location, major, and more.
- **SCHOLARSHIPS:** Use PSAT/NMSQT scores to access scholarships from the [National Merit Scholarship Corporation](#) [BigFuture Scholarships](#) and [thousand of other scholarship opportunities](#).
- **SAT PRACTICE:** Send scores to [Khan Academy](#) for a free and personalized SAT practice plan based on your student's test results.

Understanding Score Reports?

The higher the percentile, the more students your student scored higher than. Scoring above the 50th percentile means your student did better than a majority of test-takers. A "good" score then, would probably be somewhere in the 75th percentile or higher.

PSAT score percentiles change slightly each year depending on the testing class.

How Do I Know if My Student's Score is Good?

The average PSAT/NMSQT score is about 920. A score between 1210 and 1520 puts your student in the top 10% of all test takers. The PSAT/NMSQT and SAT are very similar tests. So, your student's score on the PSAT/NMSQT can give you an idea of how they will do on the SAT in March.

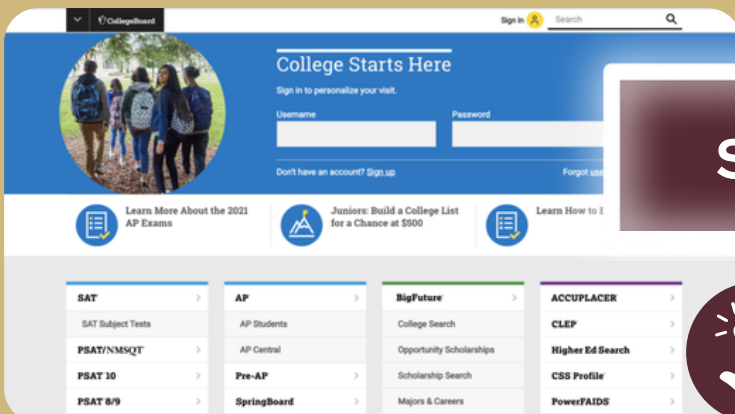
Understanding Your PSAT/NMSQT® Score Report

Ways Parents Can Help Their Child Prepare for the SAT

- **Be A Study Buddy**

Although your child might be "super motivated" to do well on the SAT, it can be challenging for your child to study on their own. This is where you come in, as a *patient*, and *supportive*, in-house *study buddy*. These are qualities not always found in friends or classmates. For example, you can go over common SAT vocabulary words, or, check the accuracy of a math problem. Your support in these activities will be of tremendous value to your child and a bonding experience for both of you.

- **Provide a Selection of Texts to Read**

One of the more challenging parts of the SAT is the reading comprehension section, which requires a student to read different types of texts and understand the vocabulary within them, as well as the test's arguments, main ideas, themes, and writing style. To help prepare for the reading section, consider helping them find and parse through the assortment of different types of writing. The SAT will ask them to answer questions on each passage or, a set of paired passages. One or more of these passages might be accompanied by a graphic, chart, bar graph, or scatterplot. These passages will often ask data interpretation questions that relate to the graph.

- **Find Worthwhile Study Tools**

While it is up to your child to actually do all of the studying, you can help by selecting which study tools should be used. There are many free online resources that can be used to help your child prepare. Another Great free online source is schoolhouse.world. CHS also offers a PSAT/SAT Prep Club with Mr. Ward they meet every Wednesday after school.

- **Hire a Tutor**

In the past, CHS has partnered with SAT prep companies to help students get ready for this important exam. When these offerings become available they are posted in the student announcements, and generally as part of Mr. Martinson's "Believe & Achieve Times".

- **Keep a Schedule**

It's easy to get overwhelmed when preparing for the SAT. One effective way for parents to support their child is to help them keep track of their SAT prep study and practice schedules. While it is ultimately the students responsibility to handle their time management, this is a learned skill that can initially be daunting. Patient and consistent parental encouragement will prove to be immensely beneficial to the student's academic success.

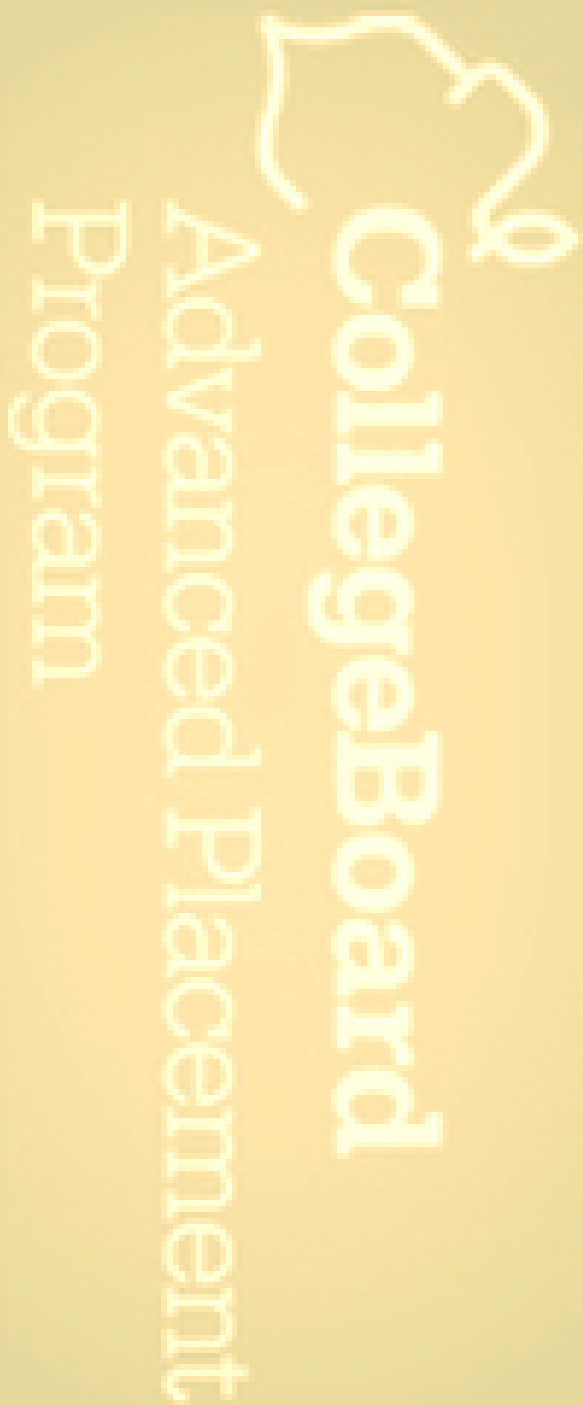

What are AP Classes?

The AP program is run by the College Board and allows your student to take special high school courses that can earn your student college credit for when they begin college.

These Courses are designed to give your student the experience of an intro-level college class while they are still in high school.

What exactly are AP Exams?

The AP exam is a test of all that your student has learned in their AP class. These classes typically allow your student to earn college credit if they pass the AP exam that is given at the end of the school year in May.

Demystifying AP Exam Fees

The Indiana Department Of Education subsidizes exam fees for S.T.E.M. (Science, Technology, English, Math) courses.

However, the following courses offered at CHS Do HAVE exam fees that are due in order to have an exam ordered for your student

- AP Art History
- AP World History: Modern
- AP Microeconomics
- AP Macroeconomics
- AP Human Geography
- AP Psychology
- AP U.S. History

IMPORTANT:

If an exam has been ordered for your student but they DO NOT take the exam the college board charges a \$40.00 unused/canceled exam fee this fee will be passed on to you. The College Board only allows a few exceptions to this unused exam fee policy.


Illness is not one of those exceptions.

Step 1: Dual Credit Registration

Before you can enroll in any dual credit course through Ivy Tech at CHS, you need to register and get a college number (C number). Step 3: Make sure Your Student Takes the Knowledge Assessment

To show that students are college ready, they will need to take two Knowledge Assessment (KA) exams. One is KA English and KA STEM/Math. Students will need to achieve a score of 70 or higher to demonstrate readiness.

If a student does not achieve a 70 or higher on their first attempt they will be provided mastery tasks to complete until their score reaches the 70 threshold. Once a student has reached the mastery threshold they are ready to take almost all the courses CHS has to offer through Ivy Tech!
