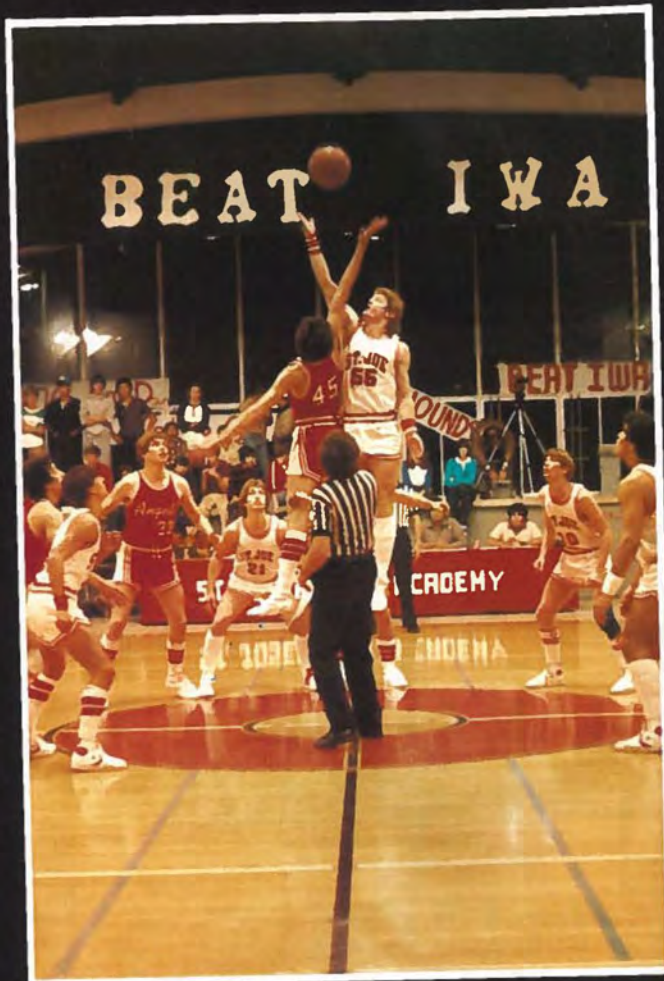

# A TRIBUTE TO BISHOP THOMAS J. DRURY

Bishop Thomas J. Drury has served as Bishop of the Diocese of Corpus Christi for eighteen years. This year he has retired. Bishop Rene H. Gracida has been appointed as his successor.

Thomas J. Drury was born in Ireland. He was ordained to the priesthood on June 2, 1935, at the Sacred Heart Church in Amarillo, Texas. Bishop Drury served in Amarillo, the U.S. Air Force, San Antonio, and Lubbock before he was appointed first Bishop of the newly-elected Diocese of San Angelo, Texas on October 16, 1961. On July 19, 1965, Bishop Drury was appointed bishop of the Diocese of Corpus Christi.

Bishop Drury began improving the Diocese almost immediately. He started by establishing the diocesan newspaper, now known as *The South Texas Catholic*. During his time as Bishop of Corpus Christi, the Diocese has grown from two diocesan offices to thirty-two funded departments. A Senate of Priests and Council of Religious have been set up. Catholic Charities was set up and has shown phenomenal growth, as have the various educational programs of the Diocese. The Office of Communications work on all levels of communication. Diocesan priests have been sent as missionaries to Arriago, Mexico. The Bishop's concern for the spiritual life of the people has led to the setting up of a Retreat Department which includes such movements as Cursillos, Marriage Encounter, and the Search program. The Department of Hispanic Affairs has also been established. On a business level, Bishop Drury organized a Financial Board to handle all of the Diocesan financial affairs.

Bishop Drury has truly been an inspiration to the people of the Diocese. His dedicated service to the Catholic Community has not gone unnoticed. He has touched the lives of many Catholics in the Diocese through his care, service, and support, and he will not be forgotten.

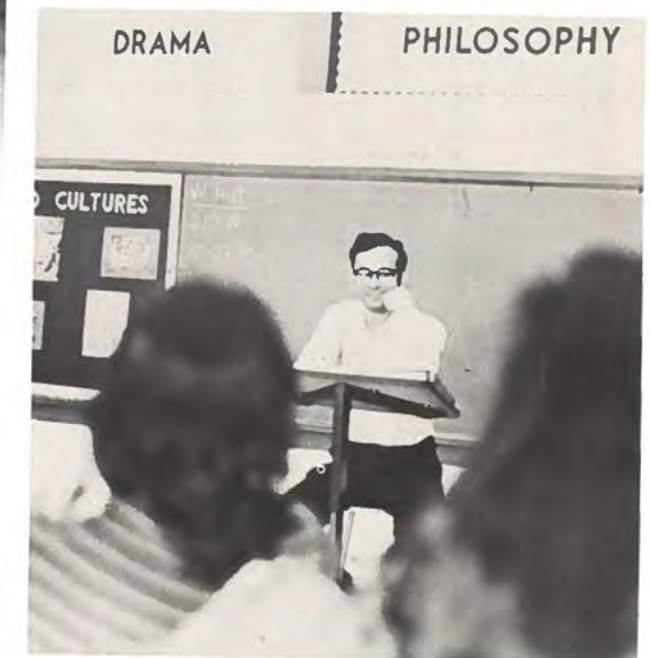

On March 19, Sister Brenda Thompson, I.W.A.'s career guidance counselor, celebrated her Silver Jubilee with a special Mass and reception.

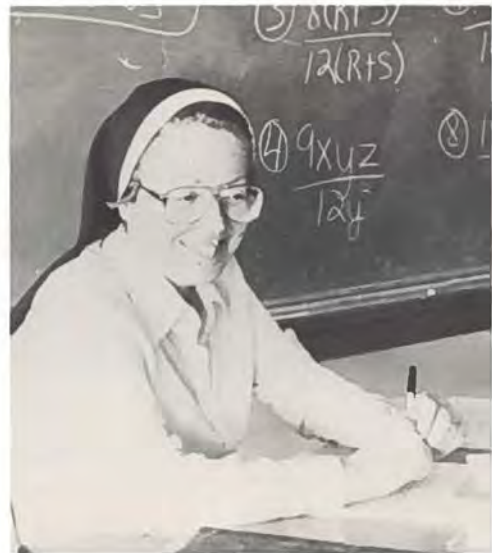
