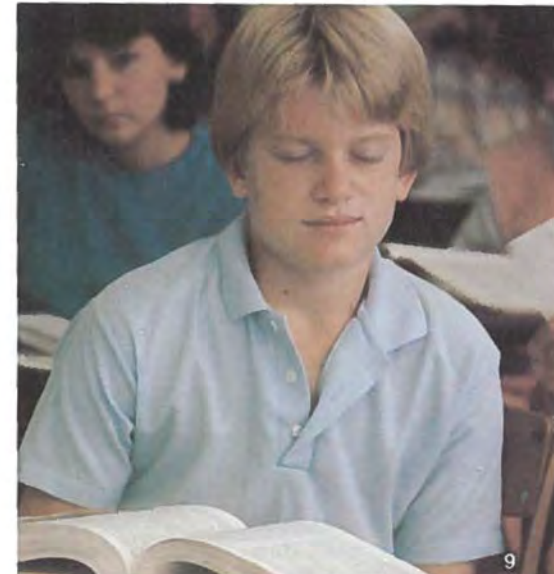
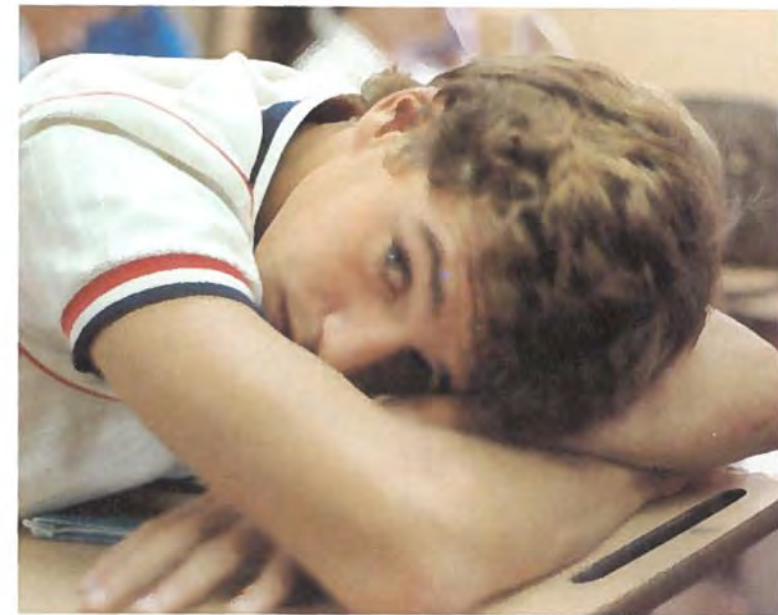




The Stars (Seniors)

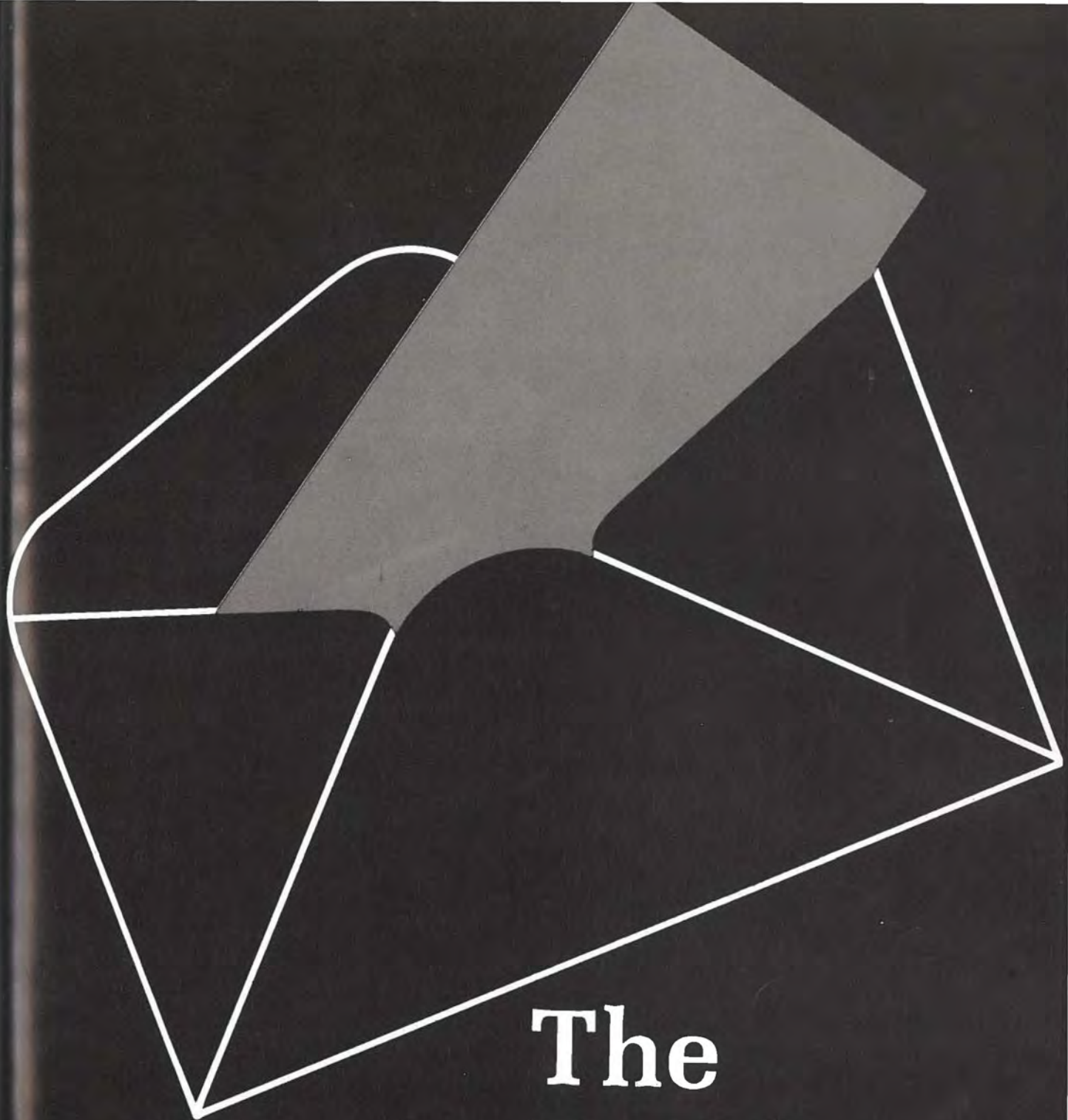
