Superintendent Josh Hurt

- Really good start to the school year. I've been pleased with all my visits to all of the buildings. I
 appreciate all of the hard work from our teachers and staff.
- We just celebrated National Principals Month, School Lunch Week, and School Bus Safety Week.
- The high school roof is finished. We had a walk-through inspection today. The report is not back yet. It looks good and is performing well.
- State test scores have been released to administrators. They are embargoed until Oct. 31. I'm looking forward to the public release.
- The annual audit is almost finished. I feel comfortable about where the district stands.
- Regarding item 5G, we accepted bids today on all dirt work for the new athletic facilities and art/multipurpose projects. We ask that you approve the lowest bid. Crews will begin removing dirt in the next couple of weeks.
- Asking board members to table agenda item 5F. It may be redundant and not necessary.
- Approving items 5G-5J will get us into the bid process for the bigger services regarding the new athletic facilities and art/multipurpose projects.
