## CROSS COUNTRY AT THE STATE CHAMPIONSHIP

On Saturday, November 25th, the Livingston High School Varsity Boys Cross Country team made their way to Woodward Park in Fresno for the California State Cross Country Meet. This marks the teams second consecutive appearance at the state meet. All four returning runners showcased improvement from 2022, with each member running faster than their previous visit last month for the Roughrider Invitational. *Cristian Lucatero* (photo below right) led the team, achieving a milestone by breaking the 17-minute barrier with a time of 16:50. The collective efforts resulted in the LHS boys securing 491 points and a commendable 20th-place finish in a highly competitive Division 4 race. Looking ahead, with all boys returning for Track in the spring, they aim to maintain these gains as they kick off their winter training cycle.



## FEMALE FALL ATHLETE OF THE SEASON

Livingston High senior *Raagni Jairath* had a perfect senior tennis season! Jairath achieved an impeccable 14-0 record in the regularly scheduled Central California Conference matches (CCC). (Livingston competes in the CCC for boys' and girls' tennis and the Trans Valley League for Co-Ed Tennis.) She faced some of the league's top players, handing them their only loss this year. Her only loss was to the eventual second-place singles player for the entire league at the conference tournament. Throughout all of these accomplishments, she maintained a remarkable 4.20 GPA and served as one of the team's leaders.



## MALE FALL ATHLETE OF THE SEASON

Livingston High senior *Cristian Lucatero* concluded his cross-country career at the California State Championship. Not only was Lucatero the team's top runner, but he also served as the team's leader. Through his leadership and consistent performance throughout the season, Lucatero guided the Pack racing team to their first Trans Valley League Boys Championship, a 2nd place finish in Division IV Sac-Joaquin Section, and a top 20 placement at the State Championship meet.
