Board Adopts Policy



Board Adopts Resolution

Board policy must require the board to adopt a resolution convening the SHAC to determine the curriculum.

Human Sexuality Instruction Requirements

BOARD POLICY

School boards must adopt a policy on the process for adoption of materials for human sexuality instruction.



The board will take actions on the SHAC's recommendations "by a record vote at a public meeting."

PARENT NOTIFICATION

Parents must be notified prior to each school year about the district's offering of instruction.

Board Votes On Recommendations



BOARD RESOLUTION

The SHAC must hold at least two public meetings and follow procedural requirements that are similar to the Texas Open Meetings Act Requirements.

PARENT CONSENT

At least 14 days before instruction, parents must receive additional notice and a request for parental consent to opt into human sexuality instruction.

District Requirements - EHAA (LOCAL)

- Resolution by Board of Trustees to convene the SHAC Adopted on January 24, 2022
- •Two public meetings April 27, 2022, and May 4, 2022



District Requirements – EHAA (LOCAL)

- •SHAC recommends curriculum materials that:
 - comply with instructional content within law
 - are suitable for the subject and grade level for which the materials are intended
 - reviewed by subject level experts in the subject and grade level for which the materials are intended
- •Present recommendation/s to the Board at and public meeting May 23, 2022

Board Votes On Recommendations

Requirements of Curriculum Materials – EHAA (LEGAL)

Instruction must:

- 1. Present abstinence as the preferred choice of behavior for unmarried persons of school age;
- 2. Devote more attention to abstinence than to any other behavior;
- 3. Emphasize that abstinence is the only method that is 100 percent effective in preventing pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, infection with HIV or AIDS, and the emotional trauma associated with adolescent sexual activity;

Requirements of Curriculum Materials – EHAA (LEGAL)

- 4. Direct adolescents to a standard of behavior in which **abstinence before marriage** is the most effective way to prevent pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, and infection with HIV or AIDS; and
- 5. Teach contraception and condom use in terms of **human use** reality rates instead of theoretical laboratory rates, if instruction on contraception and condoms is included in the curriculum.
 - "Human use" includes incorrect or inconsistent use that typically lowers effectiveness rates
