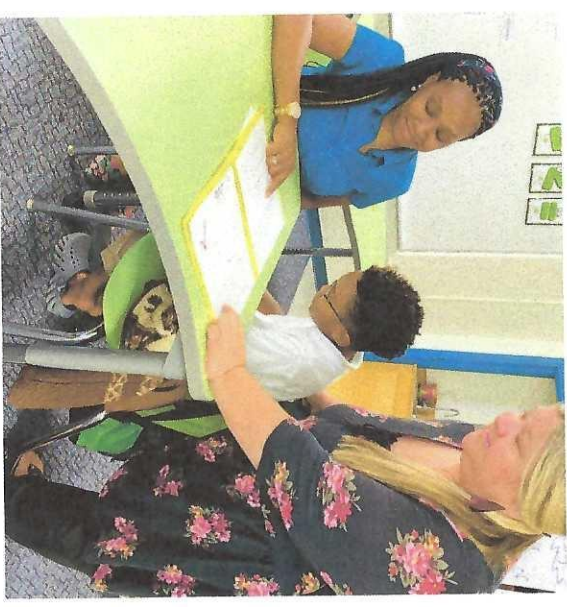

Reading/ELA: 25 percent of students will score proficient and above as measured by the 3rd grade ELA EOG assessment.


Math: 25 percent of students will score proficient and above as measured by the 3rd grade Math EOG assessment.


## Teachers, Parents, Students- Working Together for Success

### In the 3rd Grade Classroom


The 3rd Grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

 More opportunities for reading and writing will be provided for students. Strategies for reading will be taught across all content areas and shared with families.

 Opportunities for additional math practice on 3rd grade math standards and math fluency will be provided for all third grade students and progress will be monitored by teachers and families.


 Students will receive reading and math supports, based on needs, through interventions in a small group setting. Teachers will communicate progress and suggestions.

### At Home

 Ensure that students are reading at home and check for understanding

 Support students with homework and

additional math practice at home


 Make sure that students are getting the proper rest each night and limiting screen time




### Soaring Eagle Students

Students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school. Students shared the following ideas:
