PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

International Baccalaureate (IB) Programme

At Mid-Pacific, IB courses are available to students in grades 11 and 12. Participation in the IB Diploma Programme is strongly encouraged but not mandatory. Students can take just a single IB course or multiple courses up to the full IB Diploma. 87% of Mid-Pacific students score at the satisfactory level or higher on their IB exams.
