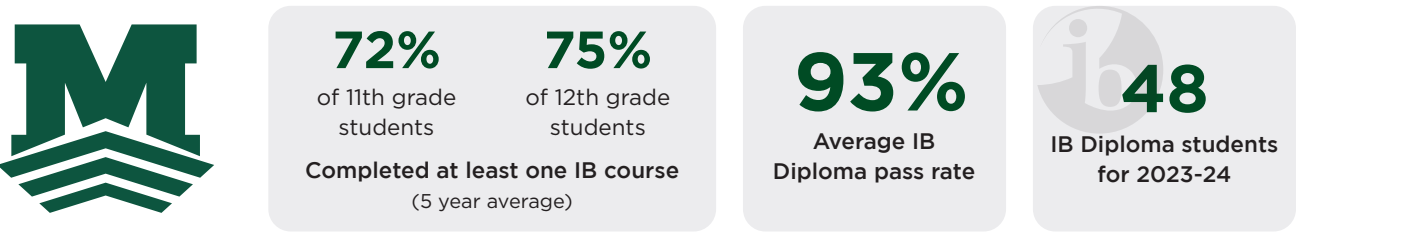

# PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

## International Baccalaureate (IB) Programme

At Mid-Pacific, IB courses are available to students in grades 11 and 12. Participation in the IB Diploma Programme is strongly encouraged but not mandatory. Students can take just a single IB course or multiple courses up to the full IB Diploma. 87% of Mid-Pacific students score at the satisfactory level or higher on their IB exams.



## Mid-Pacific School of the Arts

Mid-Pacific offers intensive arts training in dance, hula, instrumental music, media, musical theatre, theatre arts, film, visual arts, and digital arts. Whether they are fulfilling their arts elective requirements for graduation or are pursuing accelerated training through the School of the Arts Certificate Program, all students are trained by faculty who are accomplished teachers as well as noted working artists in their respective fields.
