







#### Q7 Will your student require school transportation?





Q8 I am comfortable with my student(s) being transported everyday to and from school on a deep cleaned/sanitized school bus with regular volumes of student passengers.







#### Q10 I would transport my student(s) to help reduce the number of students on a bus at any given time.





#### School Decision Tree



#### WHAT WILL IT COST TO REOPEN SCHOOLS?

This document estimates some of the expenses school districts may incur in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and as they plan to reopen for the 2020-2021 school year. These calculations assume the statistics of an average\* school district with 3.659 students, 8 school buildings, 183 classrooms, 329 staff members, and 40 school buses (transporting at 25% capacity, or 915 students, to comply with recommended social distancing guidelines).



\*Costs will vary by district depending on many factors, including regional/market price as economy of scale (i.e., larger districts may have access to lower unit costs because they can buy in higher volumes), and the availability of labor and goods necessary to comply with recommended social distancing and cleaning protocols. Model assumes 25% transportation capacity to adhere to social distancing guidelines. (Bus fleets would need to guadruple in size to safely transport 100% of students under COVID-19 circumstances, which is financially unfeasible for districts.)
