


Analysis of Distance Learning Surveys

All surveys were open until Thursday, June 18th



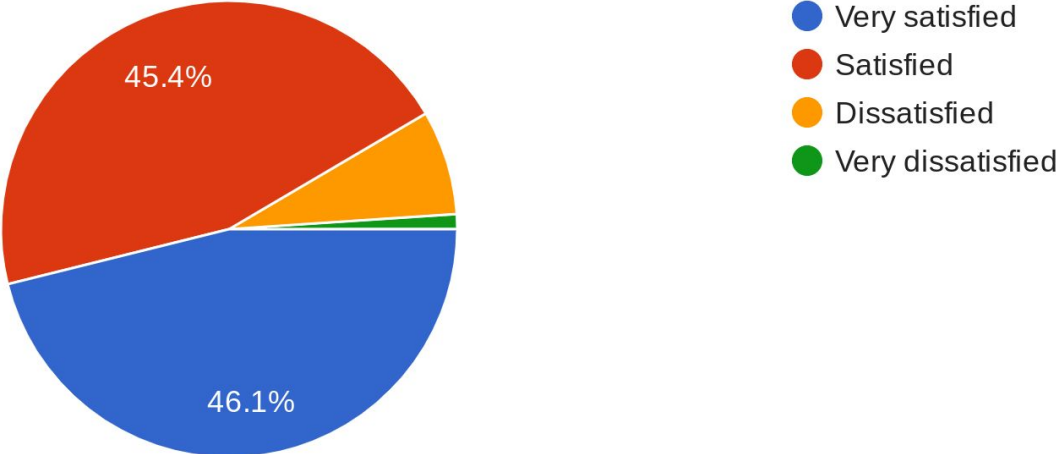
Parent Survey

experiences.**

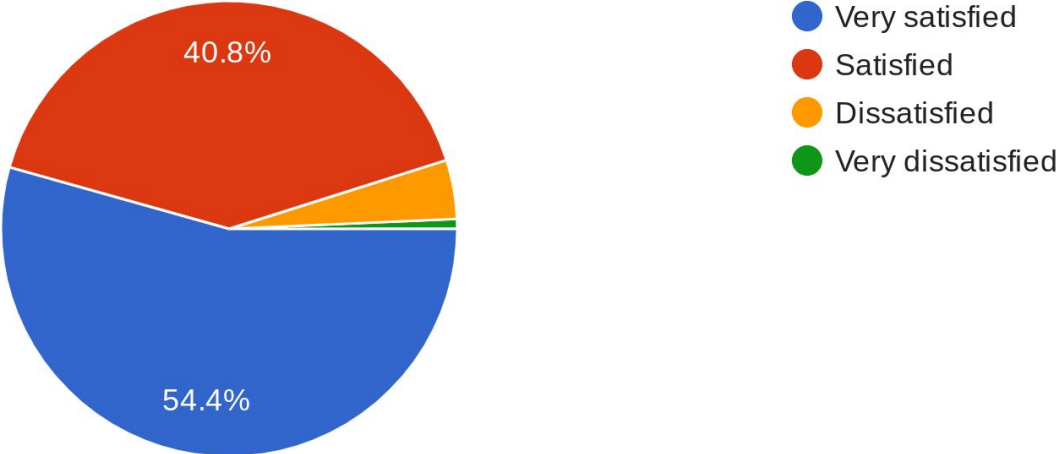
How would you rate how the district handled the emergency remote learning program?

284 responses



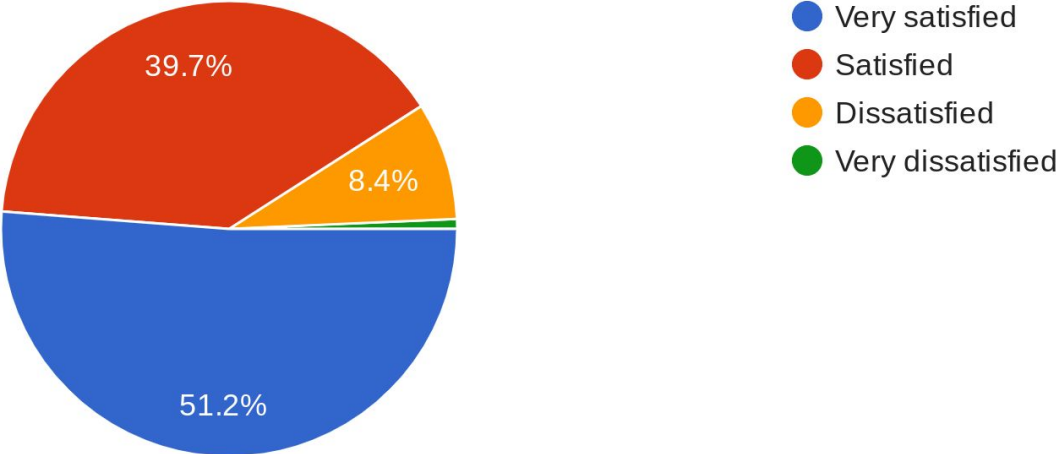
Please rate your overall experience with communication from Caledonia - Mumford Central School District during this time.

287 responses



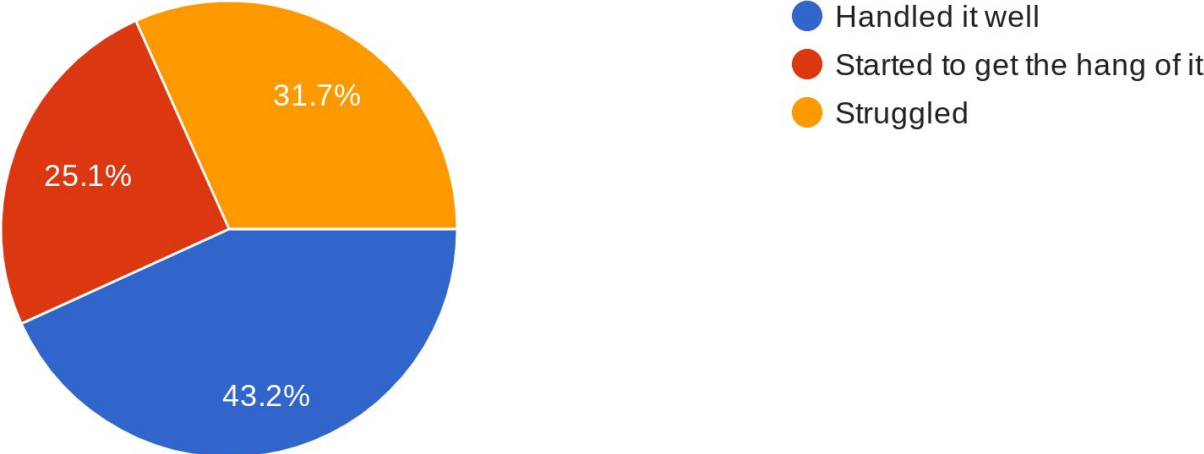
Please rate your overall experience with communication from your child(ren)'s teacher during this time.

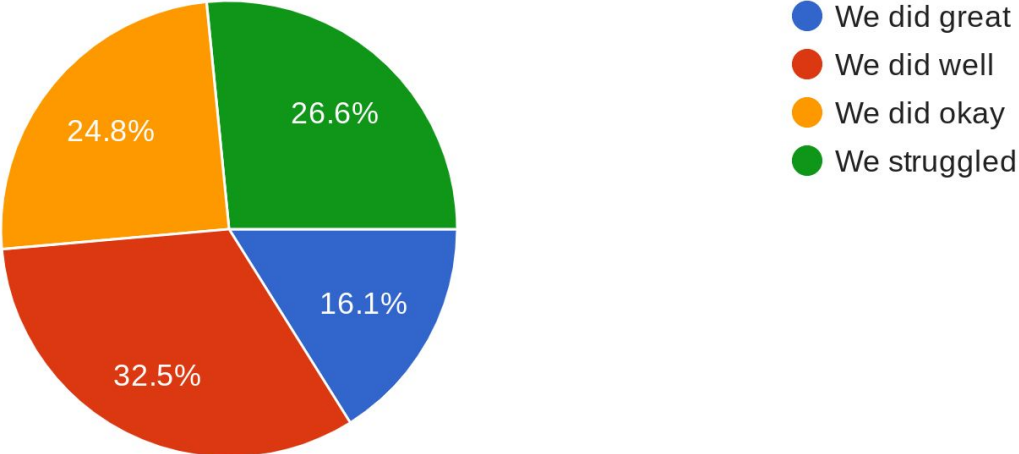
Which best describes how your CHILD(REN) adjusted to remote learning?

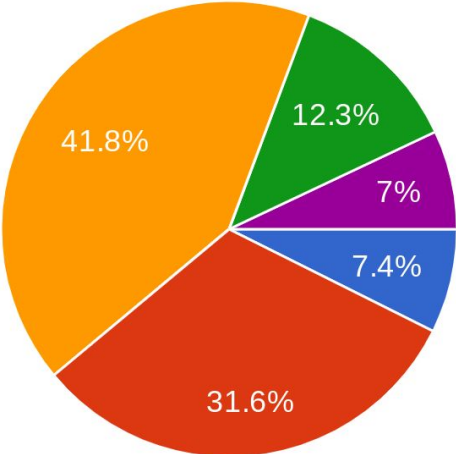
What has been the hardest challenge?

It is clear that all our families have endured challenges during this time and that each family's situation is unique. However, based on the responses in this survey, it became apparent that there are also some common themes in our data. When asked, what has been the hardest challenge, the following points were made by many families:

- Getting into a routine / keeping a consistent schedule
- Not being in school and receiving face to face instruction
- Parents working full time, either from home or as an essential worker posed to be a great challenge while doing their best to support their child(ren) with school
- Emotional strain
- Internet connectivity being reliable when multiple family members are using the wifi
- Keeping their child(ren) motivated
- Not participating in extracurriculars / athletics / social events

How would you rate the overall amount of work your child(ren) is being asked to do?

285 responses



- Completely overwhelmed - unable to complete anything
- Slightly overwhelmed - able to complete assignments on time
- Managing tasks comfortably
- Slightly underwhelmed - work gets done and my child has time to spare
- Completely underwhelmed - work is done and my child is bored

What do you think your teachers are doing well?

Overall, the data suggests that teachers did very well communicating with families. Although, we also acknowledge this is a place where there's always room for improvement. Families also reported success with the care and effort put forth by our teachers in order to keep instruction moving forward.

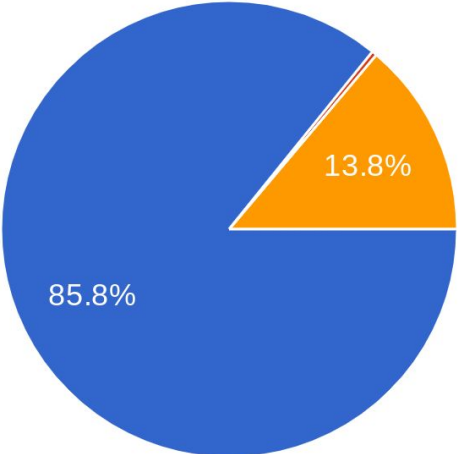
With respect to the 2020-2021 school year, how do you anticipate your internet connectivity being ?

Suggestions

Overwhelmingly the responses indicate that families would like their child(ren) back in the school building. If we were to mandiated to proceed virtually, families suggested the following:

- continue to keep the lines of communication open
- streamline online platforms
- have a balance of live and recorded content during a students school day
- offer more hands on opportunities for students to complete assignments
- offer small group learning via Zoom rather than whole group instruction



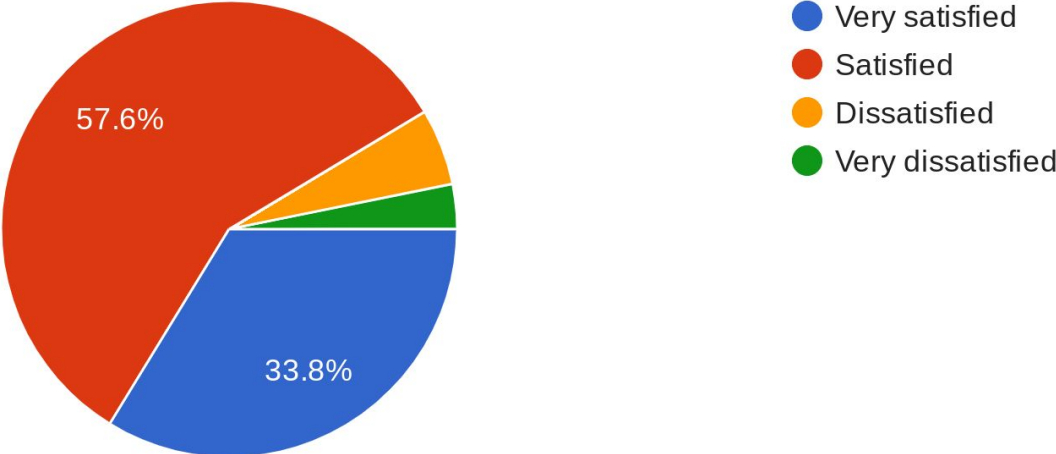

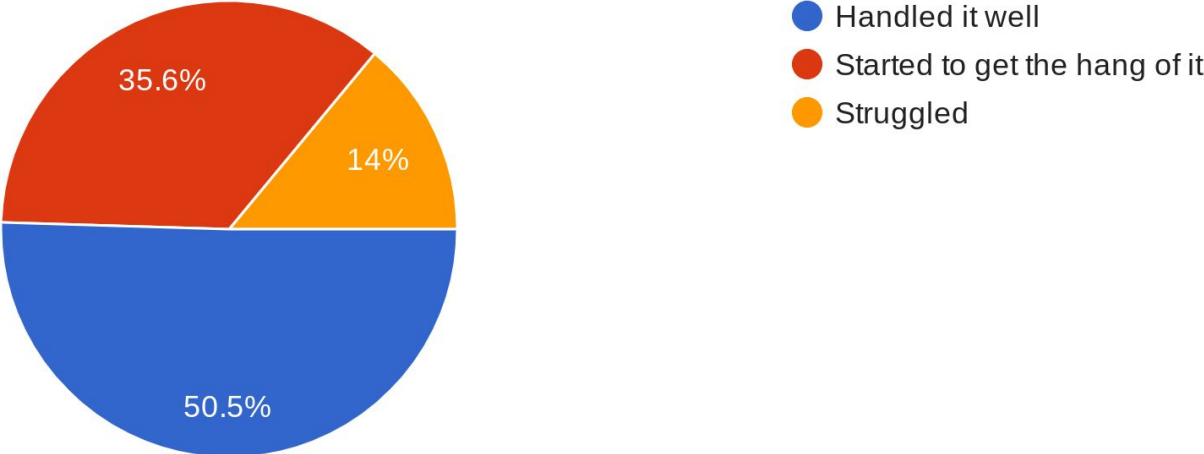
Please rate your overall experience with communication from your teacher(s) during this time.

314 responses



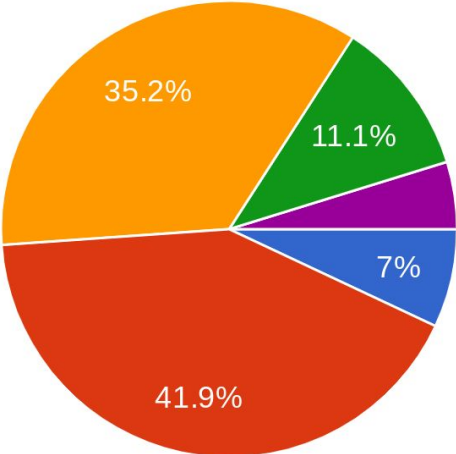
Which best describes how you adjusted to remote learning?

Students reported the following:

- meetings ran on time
- teachers communicated often
- letting students know that they are available for them
- keeping classes going
- giving time to complete work
- teachers being patient, flexible and supportive

What has been the hardest challenge?

Students reported the following:

- not seeing friends / lack of social interaction
- keeping a schedule
- staying focused
- time management
- missing the in person instruction

Do you have any suggestions for us? Anything you would like to see offered or done differently?

Students suggested the following:

- consider students new life schedules when doing remote learning
- look at workload throughout the week and coordinate with other courses so that it is more spread out
- less assignments



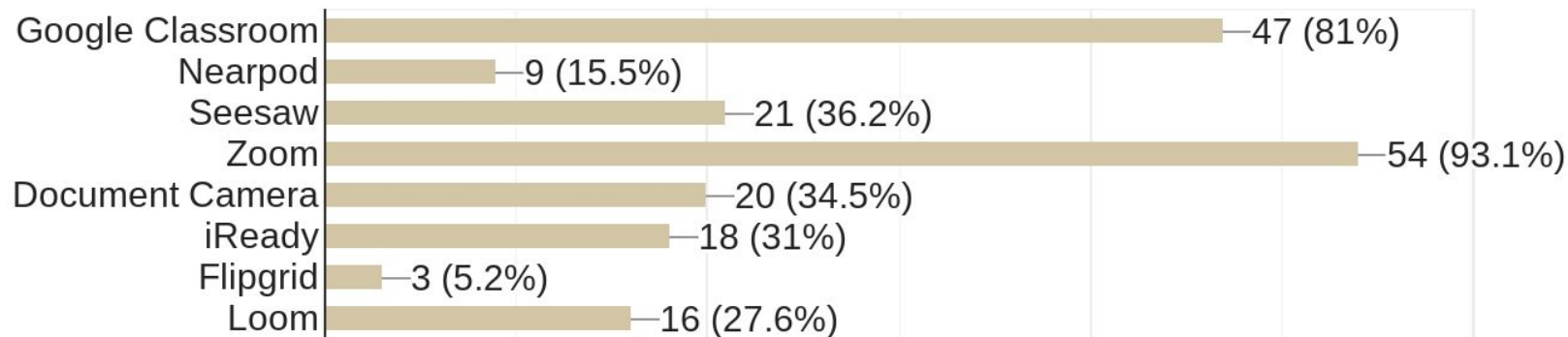
Teacher Survey
