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### PARENT WHATSAPP GROUPS

We are aware that over the last few years a number of parent led WhatsApp groups have been set up, for both classes and year groups. Although we have no issues with these groups being set up, we are aware of a number of possible pitfalls and issues that we need to draw to your attention.

Most recently we have been made aware of parents naming other children on groups, this is not an appropriate forum for this. There may be safeguarding why children should not be named. Before naming you may wish to consider how you would feel if your child was named publicly on such a group, in a number of these cases the child has been named before the school has even been informed of the alleged incident

We are also aware of misinformation being supplied on at least one group where it has been shared that we have an INSET day on Friday the 15<sup>th</sup>. To clarify this is NOT the case. Our next INSET is the 2<sup>nd</sup> January 2024. All INSET days are posted in the "Dates for your diary" section at the bottom of every week's newsletter.

Please do continue to use WhatsApp, there are many positives, but please be aware that the best line of communication to resolve concerns regarding the academy and the school day are to communicate directly with our staff, in most cases the best person being your child's class teacher who will have the greatest knowledge of incidents that may, or may not have occurred.

#### YEAR GROUP UPDATES

The children in Early Years have been learning some traditions and beliefs about Christmas and Advent. They have been exploring why we celebrate Christmas and that it is a Christian belief (not just about Father Christmas coming). The children have been fascinated by the story of the birth of Jesus and have written about it, as well as using props and nativity sets to act out the events. The story also supports their understanding of the songs we are learning for

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their Nativity. The children have also been learning a range of unfamiliar vocabulary such as manger, crib, frankincense and myrrh etc. Advent will encourage the children to use numbers for a purpose, counting forwards and backwards from 1-25. The children have been working on 'cardinal principle', which is when they count a range of objects in a set and say the total; if they understand the cardinal principle they appreciate that the last number they counted to is the number/quantity of the set. We are encouraging the children to use words such as more/most and fewer/less to describe amounts in a set. What clever children they are becoming! Next week's learning will be based on the story, 'The Jolly Christmas Postman' by the Ahlbergs. This will also give the children an opportunity to write letters themselves. Have a lovely weekend.

Happy 1<sup>st</sup> of December! This week has been a busy week looking at instructions in Year One. We have looked at a variety of instructions including, audio, visual and pictorial, then we moved onto to reading instructions to make salt-dough. Maths has seen us using our subtraction knowledge, using a range of resources to support our learning such as numbers lines, tens frames and part part whole models. What else? ... Ask us about toys from the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. Ask us about what shapes we made on the computer. And definitely ask about the skills we are learning when making our puppets! Letters have gone out in book bags this week, about our Christmas performance, 'Let there be light' please check you have received this as it outlines the starring role your child has. Have a great weekend everyone.

This week Year 2's Titanic learning continued and we started with the book 'Polar the Titanic Bear' by <u>Daisy Corning Stone Spedden</u>. It tells the story of the adventures of a boy called Douglas, told through the eyes of his white teddy bear, Polar. With this in mind, the children were asked to bring a toy to school to use as a stimulus for descriptive writing. We initially focussed on using expanded noun phrases and we were very impressed with the children's descriptions of their soft toys using exciting vocabulary. In Destination Reader, the children have been working hard to make connections with other books. Destination reader is a scheme that involves daily reading sessions which incorporate whole class modelling and the children then applying these skills through partner work and independent reading. Children get the opportunity to deepen their understanding of the texts they read through the systematic use of a series of strategies and language stems. In Maths, addition was still the focus. We added, using sequencing and applied it to money and real life problems. How is it already December? Our Christmas rehearsals are in full swing and we just want to say a huge thank you to our parents and carers for helping the children learn their lines! Have a wonderful weekend!

This week in year 3 has been hectic. Everyone prepared their weapons and tools ready for 'Iron Age' day. As part of this day, they cooked bread on the fire, made clay pots, built a hill fort then spent time invading and defending it. Their behaviour was excellent and we are so proud of them. In English they have been writing a news report about Nikolas being thrown into the tower by Father Vodol. They interviewed different elves, the guards and various other characters who witnessed what happened and used these for quotes in their reports. In maths they are learning formal methods of addition (columns) and next week they will move on to subtraction. In music the children are beginning to learn Christmas songs in preparation for our Christmas song event on the 11<sup>th</sup> of the month. For anyone who hasn't seen the message, this went out earlier in the week: Year 3 would like to celebrate all the children's hard work by watching a film on either Tuesday 12th or Wednesday 13th December. We will be watching A Boy Called Christmas which is a PG certificate. If you do not want your child to watch this, could you please inform your child's teacher? The children can bring in a small snack for themselves to eat during the film. Two weeks to go and so many exciting things to look forward to. Have a great weekend everyone.

Year 4 have had yet another busy week! In English we have been learning about playscripts. The children started the week by identifying features and acting out a scene linked to King Edward's death. They then followed this up with writing a playscript based on a short clip from the film 'How to train a Dragon – Homecoming'. Next week the children will be creating another script, this time based on our year group text Anglo Saxon boy. In maths, we have continued with our formal written method of subtraction. Towards the end of the week, we started using bar models to solve addition and subtraction calculations where some of the calculation was missing. In History we have continued to investigate the discoveries made at Sutton Hoo. The children wrote some excellent newspaper reports all about what was found. In DT we have completed our work linked to out Honey and Oat cakes. The children evaluated their designs and made suggestions about what they would do to improve their designs next time. As the temperature has now clearly dropped, please can you make sure that your child has a coat in school every day. Also can we ask that

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children keep their PE kits in school all week. We have had a number of children without kit on the days we have PE. Here is a reminder if you are unsure of the days: Juniper and Lime are Monday and Elderflower is Tuesday and Thursday this term. We hope that you all have a wonderful, if not rather chilly, weekend.

This week in Year 5, we have continued to read our book 'Once'. In grammar, we have been learning about when to use a colon to introduce a list. In English, we have been looking at poetry. This week we have been writing haikus and cinquains. The children have written some beautiful poetry based on WWII. In maths, with have continued to look at the written method for subtraction. In PSHE, we discussed if money really matters. In RE, we have been learning about stories written in the Torah. In science, we have been looking at insulators. On Tuesday 5th, we are having our own VE Day celebration. Please don't forgot to bring in some food for the banquet in the afternoon. Don't forget to log in to rollama and times tables rock stars. Have a nice weekend.

This week Year 6 have been working hard as journalists writing radio news articles for the 1920s New York news. We have been writing about incidents that have happened in the book The Good Thieves that have been worthy of reporting and practicing writing in the passive voice and using direct and reported speech. In maths we've been continuing our unit on fractions and have been learning how to add and subtract them - we must remember that we cannot add or subtract them until the denominators are the same! This has been a brain frazzling concept to learn but we're very proud of the resilience shown this week. In geography we have been revising Longitude and Latitude and will finish off our geography unit next week with looking at compass points and 6 figure grid references. In PSHEE we've had some really great discussions about bullying and why people may bully, discussing what we should do if we're being bullied. We've also looked further into celebrating differences and how instead of bullying people with differences, we should be celebrating them. We looked at Paralympians who competed in the 2020 Paralympics. We heard about their differences and resilience and amazing achievements. We felt so inspired by them we designed their very own medals! In Art we've had fun painting our pebbles based around our street art topic - it's quite tricky painting on such a small and strange surface but our designs are looking great! Next week we look forward to yes you've guessed it - more fractions! Trying to finish The Good Thieves book, writing newspaper articles, finishing off our Human Body science topic and much more! Have a great weekend!
