Providing emergency care to patients in their time of need is just what an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) does every day. Classroom and clinical experience are combined to provide just what you need to obtain your certification. A minimum of forty clinical hours are required in addition to 216 hours of class time. Background checks will be conducted for all students. Students must have shot records for clinical facilities which will include FLU, HBV and COVID series or appropriate waivers, Varicella, TDAP, and MMR. If no shot record documentation is available, students must show documentation of current titer tests. Shot records and/or titers are required at the start of class. Additional costs include books, PPD, drug screen, black EMS uniform pants, black boots, and other supplies. The PPD and drug screen deadline will be given by the instructor when class begins. You must be at least 18 to take the national certification exam which is \$104, there is an Oklahoma State EMT Certification fee of \$85. Text required.
