
# **House News**

# HOUSE GUTRIDGE

The last several months have been quite busy in House Gutridge. We've fully embraced our new Character Strong lessons that utilize the state of Ohio's Social Emotional Learning Standards. Each week we are given a Character Dare—ask your child about them. We DARE you! The Mama and Papa Bears of House Gutridge would like to congratulate our students of the week (one student per grade level is chosen every two weeks by the House teachers) and students of the month (Zach Hofman and Jake Blakeman) once again—your hard work, dedication, and kindness show. We are also very proud of those students who jumped in and helped with our Grizzlies Helping Grizzlies program—a way for students who are struggling to be paired up with a strong student. These two work together on difficult academic areas as well checking on grades and missing assignments.

We also had our first ever Survivor Competition created by Mrs. Lamb and Mrs. Hegyi. Our team of Grizzlies showed up in the gym and were given our tasks. We competed in puzzles, brainteasers, freeing objects, and a group competition of getting a tablecloth right side up with our team standing on it. We laughed, we struggled, we succeeded—we had a ton of fun. Lastly, we worked hard on our door decoration competition. Due to unforeseen circumstances, we are not allowed to continue with that competition. We were crushing it and according to Mrs. Forson, our House Dean-we had the competition in the bag. We designed our door around this year's theme, "Choose Your Adventure," as the Grizzly Space Adventure-One small step for man, one giant leap for Gutridge.
