All 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students participated in Bath Team Hero lessons focusing on the traits of a Bath Hero - Responsibility, Respect and Problem-Solving. Many students have earned Bath Team Hero Awards for demonstrating these qualities at school. As an extra reward for being a Bath Team Hero, students who earned this award during the 1st quarter were entered into a raffle to win an additional prize. Parents, ask your child about the 4 color Zones and some strategies for managing different zones. These are vital skills for living, including effective

solving.

Classroom Lessons for all grades are in full swing. The 3rd and 5th grade students had a fun and relaxing time in our outdoor NEST (N.ature E.xploration for S.tudents and T.eachers) space. The 3rd grade students loved hammocking in nature and practicing focused attention, breathing, movement and self-regulation. Fifth graders enjoyed the

communication, friendship skills, self-management, emotional regulation and problem-
