LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Stratton Families.

I hope you all had a wonderful Thanksgiving Break. We are now in a short stretch until the end of the first semester and this time will go fast. We have a few events scheduled for students this month. Keep your eyes open for communication so you don't miss out.

I hope your families are planning time together for rest and relaxation during the Winter Break. Students will be back to school on January 8, 2023. Until then have a great Holiday Season and a Happy New Year.

Attendance

As of December 1st, Stratton's Attendance Rate is 91%. This is a 5 % increase from last year's rate of 86%. While this is below the expected 95% rate, it is an improvement and something to celebrate. We tend to see an increase in absences during this time of the year due to illness and early starts to the holiday breaks, which we understand. I ask that you do your best to have your children here, especially next week because we will be engaging in Winter Benchmark Testing.

As we prepare for Winter Benchmark Testing, it is important that students are rested, fed and in attendance. As you know, this data will be used to assess and adjust our instruction for the second semester. Please talk to your child about doing their best—this helps teachers create plans that fit their needs. Your involvement is key to making sure the test results truly show what your child can do and how we can best support them.

We would love to see you at our next SAC meeting. We will be meeting on December 8th at 8:00am. This month we changed the time to accommodate parents who are not available during the evening. Be on the lookout for the agenda. I hope you can make it.
