CSDA Happenings

RMMS Happenings

Pre-K: Preschoolers began learning about the 5 senses and gingerbread. They are gearing up for a busy month of crafts and fun!

Grade K: Teachers will be introducing two more letters during Fundations next week: x and y. You may hear your child saying, "F-fox-/f/" and wonder, why fox? They focus on the /ks/ sound of *Xx* in kindergarten, so all of the words they practice will have *Xx* as the final phoneme. **Grade 1:** First graders will work with the suffix s in Fundations. In math, they will work with strategies for addition and subtraction within twenty.

Grade 2: Second graders are lighting up the month of December with kindness! Each class will be learning about the importance of being kind, how they can show more kindness, and how they can acknowledge when others are being kind.

Grade 3: Third graders are working hard on their Heritage projects and historical fiction journals leading up to their Heritage Breakfast. They are continuing division practice in math and working on learning new spelling patterns in word study.

RMMS Unified Arts: In art, students are moving on from fall-themed projects to winter and holiday themes. Projects will include painting, drawing, collage, and printmaking.

Holiday Health Tips

WHEN TO STAY HOME from school: To prevent contagious illness stay home with the following:

- Unexplained Rash- contact MD
- Uncontrolled Cough- contact MD
- Vomiting or Diarrhea until symptomfree for 24 hours
- Fever until fever-free without medication for 24 hours

CIRCULATING: <u>Strep Throat</u>, <u>Stomach III-</u> <u>ness</u>, <u>Pneumonia</u>, <u>Bronchitis</u>, and the following:

<u>Croup</u> The croup cough sounds like a harsh "barking" sound. This is the most common symptom of croup. Your child may also have stridor which is a raspy, vibrating sound that occurs when your child is breathing in. Hand Foot and Mouth (Coxsackie Virus) Having direct contact with nose and throat secretions of an infected person may spread the infection. It may also be spread by the aerosol droplet route (e.g., sneezing, coughing). Or when you touch an object with the virus on it and then touch your face. Blisters may appear in the mouth, on the sides of the tongue, inside the cheek and on the gums. Lesions may also occur on the palms, fingers, soles of feet and buttocks. Most lesions persist for 7-10 days. A low-grade fever may accompany the illness for one to two days.

<u>RSV</u> (Respiratory Syncytial Virus) Common symptoms include runny nose, decrease in appetite, cough, sneezing, fever and wheezing. Most RSV infections resolve on their own in a week or two, but RSV can also cause more severe infections such as bronchiolitis and pneumonia (infection of the lungs).

<u>COVID-19</u> Common symptoms include Sore throat, Congestion or runny nose, Headache, Cough, Fatigue, Fever, Chills, Muscle or body aches, loss of taste or smell, Nausea or vomiting, Diarrhea. Obtain a COVID test with any symptoms. To order 4 free COVID rapid tests <u>https://www.covid.gov/tests</u> What should we do if we test positive for COVID? Isolate and Contact the school nurse. Symptom start date or test positive date is Day Zero, then isolate days 1-5 and wear a well fitting mask days 6-10.

Follow the CDC Guidelines for Isolation If someone in the household tests positive, start wearing a well fitting mask for 10 days from exposure. If you have any symptoms, test for COVID right away.
